

PASTOR'S PAGE

Lent Already?

Almost as quickly as Christmas seems to come and go, we just as quickly turn around and begin the Lent season!

It's always helpful for me to think about where we've been and how the church seasons shape us: Advent points us to God's promises of what is to come and reminds us of God's faithfulness as we wait and prepare. Christmas shows us how God puts on flesh in order to be here on earth with us. Epiphany begins to show us who Jesus is and the prophecies that his presence fulfills, with the weeks after Epiphany beginning to show us this new way of living that we are called into.

Lent shows us why all of this matters.

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday (February 18 this year) where we hear the words, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return." Those words help us recognize the frailty of human existence, the reality of our personal and collective sin, and our deep need for Jesus, who forgives our sin and gifts us with hope for life eternal.

As the season begins we are called to turn our attention to "fasting, prayer, and almsgiving," activities meant to quiet our minds, still our hearts, and draw near to God.

In an ever-ironic twist to that, we will have additional activities here at St. Paul's to help you focus and settle into this rhythm of life. In addition to our regular Saturday and Sunday worship services and Sunday School classes, you are invited to join us at church on Wednesdays. The community gathers here as the churches of the Cole Camp Area Church Alliance take turns hosting breakfast - ***this year starting at 8:30 am***, a little later than in years past. We then return to the building on Wednesday evenings for supper at 6:00 pm, worship at 7:00 pm, and refreshments and fellowship to follow the service.

It's just around the corner, and I hope you'll be able to join us for this meaningful season.



TREASURER, CONTINUED

Note A: As of December 31, 2025, 100% of the year has elapsed, however, offerings as a percent of budget are only 91.67%. This indicates that offerings are approximately \$11.950 short of budgeted amounts.

Note B : Includes \$253,802.85 in roof replacement expenses and \$12,800.00 for parsonage window replacement (both of which were paid from insurance proceeds) and \$82,162.58 in property acquisition costs. Additionally, property/liability insurance premiums of \$44,789.90 were paid which is an increase of \$24,000 from 2024.

Note C: Includes \$2,468.96 of Communities of Calling Funds.

Note D: Includes restricted amounts of \$15,000 for Little Blessings and \$1,460.75 for Sunday School.

Note E: Includes \$85,334.89 in grant funds.




