



Organ Voluntaries in February

In recognition of Black History Month, this month's organ voluntaries have been selected to showcase works by Black composers. This week we will hear music by composers Samuel Coleridge-Taylor and Fela Sowande.

Samuel Coleridge-Taylor (1875-1912) was born in Holborn (London) to an English mother and Sierra Leonean father who was among the many slaves freed and evacuated to England after the American Revolutionary War. A musical prodigy, he was championed by his teachers Charles Villiers Stanford and Edward Elgar and received many accolades in his short lifetime as a composer, political activist, and promoter of African and African-American music. He died tragically at the age of 37 from complications from pneumonia.

Fela Sowande (1905-1987) was born in Lagos, Nigeria, the son of an Anglican priest. Growing up as a choirboy, he was taken under the wing of Nigerian church music pioneer T.K. Ekundayo Philips who pushed the young musician to go on to further studies at the University of London and Trinity College of Music. Throughout the 1930's and 40's, he established himself in London as a sought-after theatre organist and pianist, performing alongside Fats Waller, Adelaide Hall, and Vera Lynn. He would later return to Nigeria to direct music for the Nigerian Broadcasting Corporation and in 1968 he settled in the United States where he would serve on faculty at Howard University, the University of Pittsburgh, and finally at Kent State University.

All are invited to receive communion, which will be distributed at the communion rail. A reminder that intinction (or dipping the bread into the cup) is considered unsafe, and is thus not permitted. If you have mobility issues, you may remain seated and communion will be brought to you.

Prayers for healing with the laying-on-of-hands and anointing may be sought in the Lady Chapel (to the left of the high altar) during Communion. You may ask for prayers for yourself, or for the needs of another. Information shared during these prayers is kept in the strictest confidence.
