

# *The Sacrament of Holy Baptism*

## Presentation and Examination of the Candidates

*Presider* The candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

*Prnts./Spons.* I present Harrison, Enzo and Shilorah to receive the sacrament of baptism.

*When all have been presented the Presider asks the parents/sponsors:*

*Presider* Will you be responsible for seeing that this child  
you present is nurtured in the faith and life  
of the Christian community? *Answer* I will,  
with God's help.

*Presider* Will you by your prayers and witness help this child  
to grow into the full stature of Christ? *Answer* I will,  
with God's help.

*Then the Presider asks the candidates/parents/sponsors:*

<i>Presider</i>	Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?	<i>Answer</i>	I renounce them.
<i>Presider</i>	Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?	<i>Answer</i>	I renounce them.
<i>Presider</i>	Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?	<i>Answer</i>	I renounce them.
<i>Presider</i>	Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Saviour?	<i>Answer</i>	I do.
<i>Presider</i>	Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?	<i>Answer</i>	I do.
<i>Presider</i>	Do you promise to obey him as your Lord?	<i>Answer</i>	I do.

*After the candidates have been presented, the Presider addresses the congregation.*

*Presider* Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support Harrison, Enzo and Shilorah in their life in Christ? **We will.**

### **Prayers for the Candidate**

<i>Presider</i>	Let us now pray for these persons who are to receive the sacrament of new birth.
<i>Deacon</i>	Deliver them, O Lord, from the way of sin and death. <b>Lord, hear our prayer.</b>
<i>Deacon</i>	Open their hearts to your grace and truth. <b>Lord, hear our prayer.</b>
<i>Deacon</i>	Fill them with your holy and life-giving Spirit. <b>Lord, hear our prayer.</b>
<i>Deacon</i>	Teach them to love others in the power of the Spirit. <b>Lord, hear our prayer.</b>
<i>Deacon</i>	Send them into the world in witness to your love. <b>Lord, hear our prayer.</b>
<i>Deacon</i>	Bring them to the fullness of your peace and glory. <b>Lord, hear our prayer.</b>
<i>Deacon</i>	Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and for ever. <b>Amen.</b>

## *The Celebration of Baptism*

### **The Thanksgiving over the Water**

*The Presider blesses the water.*

*Presider* The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

*Presider* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

*All* **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

*Presider* We give you thanks, almighty God and Father, for by the gift of water you nourish and sustain all living things.

*All* **Blessed be God for ever.**

*Presider* We give you thanks that through the waters of the Red Sea, you led your people out of slavery to freedom in the promised land.

*All* **Blessed be God for ever.**

*Presider* We give you thanks for sending your Son Jesus. For us he was baptized by John in the river Jordan. For us he was anointed as Christ by your Holy Spirit. For us he suffered the baptism of his own death and resurrection, setting us free from the bondage of sin and death, and opening to us the joy and freedom of everlasting life.

*All* **Blessed be God for ever.**

*Presider* We give you thanks for your Holy Spirit who teaches us and leads us into all truth, filling us with its gifts so that we might proclaim the gospel to all nations and serve you as a royal priesthood.

*All* **Blessed be God for ever.**

*Presider* We give you thanks for you have called them to new life through the waters of baptism. Now sanctify this water, that your servants who are washed in it may be made one with Christ in his death and resurrection, to be cleansed and delivered from all sin. Anoint them with your Holy Spirit and bring them to new birth in the family of your Church, that they may become inheritors of your glorious kingdom. We give you praise and honour and worship through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and for ever.

*All* **Blessed are you, our strength and song, and our salvation.**

*Presider* Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

## **The Baptismal Covenant**

*Presider* Do you believe in God the Father?

*All* **I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

*Presider* Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

*All* **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

*Presider* Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

*All* **I believe in God the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

*Presider* Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

*All* **I will, with God's help.**

*Presider* Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

*All* **I will, with God's help.**

*Presider* Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ?

*All* **I will, with God's help.**

*Presider* Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself?

*All* **I will, with God's help.**

*Presider* Will you strive for justice and peace among all people,  
and respect the dignity of every human being?

*All* **I will, with God's help.**

*Presider* Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation,  
and respect, sustain and renew the life of the Earth?

*All* **I will, with God's help.**

## **The Baptism**

*The candidates are presented to the Presider.*

*Presider* Harrison, Enzo and Shilorah, I baptize you in the name of the Father,  
and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

*All* **Amen.**

*Using chrism, the Presider makes the sign of the cross on the forehead, saying:*

*Presider* I sign you with the cross, and mark you as Christ's own for ever.

*The Presider prays over the newly baptized.*

*Presider* Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit  
you have bestowed upon these your servants the forgiveness of sin,  
and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit.  
Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere,  
a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works.

*All* **Amen.**

## **The Giving of the Light**

*The Presider then gives to the newly baptized a lighted candle, saying:*

*Presider* Receive the light of Christ, to show that you have passed from darkness to light.

*When the newly baptized have received a candle, the people say:*

*All* **Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works  
and glorify your Father in heaven.**

*Presider* Let us welcome the newly baptized.

*All* **We receive you into the household of God.  
Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection,  
and share with us in his eternal priesthood.**


