Qualifications

1. Personal Faith & Character
 - A committed follower of Jesus Christ who exhibits a genuine love for God and others.
 - Demonstrates integrity, compassion, and a servant's heart.
2. Spiritual Maturity
 - Willingness to pray with and for the individuals being visited.
 - Familiarity with Scripture and the ability to offer spiritual encouragement.
3. Interpersonal Skills
 - Warm, friendly demeanor with strong communication and listening skills.
 - Ability to empathize, show compassion, and maintain confidentiality.
4. Dependability
 - Able to follow through with reporting any concerns or needs to the ministry leader.

Responsibilities

1. Regular Visits
 - Conduct in-person visits or phone calls with assigned individuals (homebound, hospitalized, or in need of special care).
 - Offer companionship, conversation, and a listening ear.
2. Prayer & Encouragement
 - Pray with and for those you visit, sharing Scripture and words of hope.
 - Provide spiritual and emotional support, helping them feel connected to the church family.
3. Assess Needs & Follow-Up
 - Keep the ministry leader informed of any changes in a person's situation or immediate concerns.
4. Demonstrate God's Love
 - Represent Christ and FCC with compassion, kindness, and authenticity in every visit.
 - Uphold the church's values, maintaining a respectful and uplifting attitude.

Expectations

1. Consistency & Commitment
 - Be punctual and prepared (mentally, emotionally, and spiritually) for each visit.
2. Confidentiality
 - Respect and protect the privacy of those you visit by keeping sensitive information within the ministry team and church leadership as appropriate.
3. Positive Attitude
 - Approach challenges or difficult situations with a spirit of unity, prayer, and problem-solving.

4. Attend occasional team meetings or training sessions to stay connected, share insights, and grow in effectiveness.
 - Continue to grow in your personal relationship with God through Bible study, prayer, and active church involvement.
 - Seek mentorship or guidance from ministry leaders or church staff if you encounter challenges you are unsure how to handle.
