The Lord's Prayer: Reflections on the Petitions

Join us this Lent as we embark on a gentle 7-week study of the petitions in the Lord's Prayer. This is a course designed for everyone who ever wanted to dig a bit more deeply into the words we pray together every Sunday.

It is an email-based course and material will be sent every Monday, Wednesday and Friday; beginning on Ash Wednesday. In each email you will find some art, a reflection on part of the prayer – beginning with “Our Father”, and a link to some music to help guide your meditation on the topic.

The course is based on the book *Prayer* by Karl Barth but can be enjoyed with or without reading the book. It is a self-paced and self-directed course with the opportunity to do as much or as little as you wish. We will offer a Zoom meeting every two weeks if you are interested to talk about what we have been studying.
