## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What do we burn on Shrove Tuesday?

We burn Palm Branches from last year's Palm Sunday celebration.

Why do we burn the Palm Branches?

We burn them to create the ashes we will use to mark the Cross on our foreheads, at the Ash Wednesday Service, the next night.

What else do we sometimes burn?

We "shrive," or write our confession/s privately on paper, then we burn them with the palms. We see this as an act of absolution and forgiveness from our sins.

## Frequently Asked Questions:

### What is Ash Wednesday?

The first day of the Season of Lent.

The Season of Lent is the 40 Days leading up to Easter. During these weeks, we remember and contemplate the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, being tempted by Satan, before His death on the Cross. On this day we also confess our sins and receive forgiveness and Holy Communion.

### Why do we mark Ash Crosses on our foreheads?

Using ashes is a sign of repentance, and an ancient practice, often mentioned in the Bible. The symbol reminds us of our mortality as humans, of our sin, and of the grace and redemption we are given through the Cross of Christ.

### Do I have to receive Ashes on my forehead?

Everyone is invited, but no one has to receive Ashes. You may also choose to have them marked on your hand or palm.
