On January the 11th, at 3:00 PM, Mr. Wade Davis will present a performance of Baroque cello music. This music of the 17th and 18th centuries would be the music heard throughout Europe during the time of the Salzburger's Exile and the time of this congregation's formation at Ebenezer. What a wonderful chance to bring time period music to life with the wonderful acoustics in this historic church.

About Mr. Davis:
He attended the **Peabody Conservatory of the Johns Hopkins University**, where he earned both a **Master's Degree in Baroque Cello Performance** and a **Graduate Performance Diploma in Historical Cello** under the guidance of **John Moran**. Today, Wade Davis is increasingly recognized as one of the leading voices among a new generation of American Baroque cellists. His performances are praised for their warmth of tone, stylistic integrity, and expressive freedom. Drawing from his deep study of historical performance traditions, Wade brings vitality and nuance to the works of Bach, Vivaldi, and the rich repertoire of 17th- and 18th-century music.

A sought-after collaborator and soloist, he performs regularly with period ensembles and chamber groups throughout the Southeast and beyond. With his blend of scholarship and passion, **Wade Davis continues to shape a distinctive career as a Baroque cellist in high demand**, engaging audiences with performances that connect the elegance of the past to the immediacy of the present.

Congregation Committees

Nominating committee – may consist of the outgoing members of the Congregation Council whose term will expire at the annual meeting.

Audit committee – an audit committee of three voting members may be elected by the Congregation Council. Audit committee members shall not include the treasurer, financial secretary or Congregation Council. Term of office will be three years, with one member elected each year. Members are eligible for reelection.

Staff Support committee – may be appointed by the Congregation Council, to include the Vice-Chair, one other council member, and no fewer than four (4) voting members of the congregation. Term of office shall be three years, or term of Council position, with two members appointed each year. This committee will meet quarterly.

When a pastoral vacancy occurs, a **Call Committee** of six voting members may be appointed by the Congregation Council. Term of office will terminate upon installation of the newly called pastor.

Christian Education/Youth – shall oversee the educational ministry of this congregation. Activities include, but are not limited to:

Providing materials and staff for weekly Sunday Church School

Providing instruction in Lutheran faith and doctrine for new members

Overseeing the instruction of non-confirmed members, which leads to the Rite of Confirmation

Providing a Vacation Church School experience for the community

Encouraging all members to actively study the Word of God.

Oversee the Lutheran Youth organization and provide adult supervision for the programs and activities of the youth of the congregation of all ages, focusing on faith development and spiritual growth for children and teenagers.

Evangelism committee – shall stimulate and lead the congregation in continuous endeavors to strengthen its spirituality or reawaken members who have become indifferent and reach others, not members of the Church with the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Finance – in consultation with representatives of each committee shall prepare a draft budget for presentation to the Congregation Council at its regular November meeting each year for approval before being presented to the congregation at the Annual meeting. This budget shall indicate the intended support for local, synodical and churchwide ministries as the expression of this congregation's work in the name of Christ. The committee shall exercise oversight of all the financial affairs of the congregation and make sure that they are being conducted properly, giving particular attention to the payment of obligations and the regular forwarding of benevolences to the synodical treasurer. The committee shall be responsible to advise the Congregation Council concerning the congregation's investments and insurance programs. **/Stewardship committee** – shall endeavor to evoke and promote expressions of Christian faith in the daily lives of all members teaching Christians to use their time, talents, and resources for the ongoing work of the Christian Church, locally, nationally, and throughout the world.

Social Ministry committee – shall be responsible to initiate and maintain ministries of compassion and helpfulness for the ill, the oppress, the underprivileged, the imprisoned, and in general, all persons of all ages which are in need of aid for the body or soul.

Worship and Music committee – shall advise and assist the Congregation Council in seeing that the services in God's house are conducted regularly and in accordance with the practices and liturgy of the ELCA. It shall be the responsibility of the committee to promote and maintain church choir, to secure appropriate accompaniment for each service, and provide proper appointments such as paraments, hymnals, and worship materials.

Property committee – shall see to the care and maintenance of the grounds, equipment, and the facilities of the congregation.

Special Events committee – shall provide and host special programs for the development of Christian fellowship within the congregation and community.

Memorial committee – shall see to the receipt and disposition of funds and gifts given in memory of/or in honor of Christians or to the Glory of God through this congregation. There shall be no less than three members of this committee, serving without term. The congregation treasurer shall be a standing member of this committee. It shall be the committee's duty to recommend appropriate gifts that can be given, or to secure items appropriate with funds given, with the consent of Congregation Council.
