Reflection Questions and Activities

1. Do you know God on a factual-truth level, or do you know him on an experiential-truth level?

6 Common Heresies Regarding the Trinity

Unitarianism

What is this heresy: There is one God that is one person (also related to *Monarchianism*)

Why this is a heresy: Scripture teaches that there is one God that exists in three persons (Deuteronomy 6:4, Matthew 28:19, John 1:1)

Tritheism

What is this heresy: There are three distinct Gods

Why this is a heresy: Scripture teaches that there is one God in three persons (Deuteronomy 6:4, Matthew 28:19, John 1:1)

Partialism

What is this heresy: God is $\frac{1}{3}$ the Father, $\frac{1}{3}$ the Son, and $\frac{1}{3}$ the Spirit

Why this is a heresy: Each member of the Trinity is fully God (John 1:1)

Modalism

What is this heresy: The belief that there is one God who is one person that appears in three (or more) ways (also related to *Modalistic Monarchianism*)

Why this is a heresy: There is one God who exists as three distinct persons, each simultaneously fully God (Matthew 3:16-17, Luke 22:41-42)

Subordinationism

What is this heresy: The Son and Spirit are inferior to the Father in some way, either in divinity, status, or nature (a result of *Arianism*)

Why this is a heresy: The Son and the Spirit are coequal to the Father (This is a fundamental misunderstanding of the ideas of authority and submission)

Arianism

What is this heresy: That Jesus was created by God

Why this is a heresy: Jesus is God and is uncreated, as he is eternal (John 1:1)
