Our false judgments, our uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbours, and our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us, especially Queer siblings in Christ, Black, Indigenous and other people of colour, we confess to you.  
**Have mercy on us, O God.**

Our waste and pollution of your creation, and our lack of concern for the climate crisis and for those who come after us, we confess to you.

**Have mercy on us, O God.**

Restore us, O God, and let your anger depart from us.
