We heard you say 'Welcome to St Paul's'

From Pastor Neville and Pastor Sue

On Sunday February 8, Pastor Nev mentioned in his sermon the Seven (7) key themes or focus points identified in late 2024 through the Called to Listen- Called to Be study of Scripture and through prayer and discernment of the workshops associated with the study.

Those key themes/focus points are

Worship and spiritual purpose: Ensure that worship (word and sacrament) and prayer remain central, accessible, and meaningful to all members. Emphasis on intergenerational faith-sharing and deeper scriptural engagement.

Welcoming and belonging: Aspiration to be a welcoming and safe space for all people, particularly marginalised groups and those who feel distant from traditional church settings.

Authentic, joyful service: Desire for serving others to move beyond a sense of duty to a genuine expression of love, compassion, and hospitality inspired by Christ's example of humility.

Outreach and engagement: Particularly around engaging more deeply with the needs of the local area, actively going out of the church instead of expecting people to come in.

Diversity and inclusion: Emphasis on women's ordination, gender equality more broadly, and cultural diversity.

Unity and community: Working side by side in service and being united in Christ's love as a family despite our differences.

Trust and hope: Strong sense of needing to trust God through uncertainty, particularly in discerning the direction for the church or in times of division.

Pastor Nev reminded us of the first two of these as we heard in Matthew 5 that we are the light of the world and we are like a city on a hill which shines the light of Christ for pilgrims, travellers, searchers, sinners, and welcomes people. We were introduced to a Statement of Welcome from Coventry Cathedral which Pastor Sue and he had recently seen. The full statement is on page 3 and you were asked for feedback on two questions

1. What would you include in a statement of welcome for people who come to St Paul's?

2. What are the key things for us to be light which welcomes children, pilgrims, tourists and sinners to St Paul's

We received around 77 pieces of feedback. THANK YOU! The pastors with the Pastoral Assistant team met this week to discuss the feedback.

In response to Q. 1, the major common thread was that a number of people thought the Coventry Cathedral statement was good for us to consider and there were suggestions to add to it and calls for us to honestly see if we could live up to the statement. It is vital that we are ready to listen to people who provide honest feedback of their experiences, whether positive or negative. And some people have courageously shared their negative experiences with us. We can learn and we can grow.

In relation to Q 2 the major common thread was a call for us to be light for travellers, pilgrims, tourists by having attitudes of being non-judgemental and accepting of people just as our Lord welcomed all people. In this regard, one specific piece of feedback suggested an accessibility guide which could be co-created with people with diverse needs.

We'll keep you posted in coming weeks about how we may follow up your wonderful feedback and please continue to share your thoughts with Pastor Sue and I or any of the Pastoral Assistants.
