Your Marching Orders!

I. The Positioning (1-4)

God will lead His people, but they must see and follow.

II. The Promise (5-13)

God will work miraculously where He leads His people, but they must be sanctified and believe.

III. The Parting (14-17)

God's people will experience His workings, but they must obey Him.

1. Read Joshua 3:1-4. God let Israel know through Joshua that He would lead them. What were they to do and why?

2. In Joshua 3:5 the people are told to consecrate themselves. What did that mean and why would they be told to do this?

3. Read Joshua 3:6-13. What did God reveal He would do for the people, for Joshua, and for the priests? What were they to do?

Might God expect you to do the same type of things? What would it look like in your life?

Which is the hardest for you and why?

4. Read Joshua 3:14-17. What did the priests and Israelites need to do? What did God do?

Do you believe God desires to work in and through you? Why, or why not?

What do you need to supply and what does it look like?

How does this give a picture of the work of Christ?
