He studied philosophy & theology at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary, where he also served as organist, cantor, and liturgical Master of Ceremonies and has had music published. Upon ordination, Father Friel served for five years as Parochial Vicar at Saint Anselm Church in Northeast Philadelphia. He also worked with several communities of young adults and coached CYO basketball and volleyball, and also served as Vocation Director for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia.

Born in Bethlehem, PA, Father Friel grew up in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Parish. He enjoys climbing mountains, visiting national parks, running, reading, and sports of all kinds.

In the Philadelphia region, **83% of Catholics are not active in the sacramental life** of the Church. And millions of others aren't Catholic yet. That's not a statistic—it's a *mission field*.

Missionary hubs are dedicated teams who focus their time, energy, and resources to serve people who feel far from the Church by integrating pastoral, educational, and charitable ministries. Hubs are planted in existing parishes but with a focus to bring everyone to the Eucharistic table.

The Vision:

- **50 hubs in 10 years** (1 for every 5 parishes)
- **First five launched in 2025**—one per county
- **Privately funded** to ensure long-term sustainability.

How They Work:

- **Professionally staffed teams** under parish leadership, trained in missionary discipleship
- **Tailored to local needs:** Each hub tailors its programs & ministries to the unique needs of its local community, whatever they may be.
- **Collaborative network:** Connecting parishes, schools, Catholic Charities, and religious communities for a unified mission
- **Relationship-focused:** Our goal is to facilitate stronger, deeper relationships among individuals, families, and with God.

From Listening to Action

The Trust and Hope Initiative emerged from **100+ listening sessions** with more than **15,000 participants**. What we heard is that the Church of Philadelphia is poised for growth, but in order to grow, we must first shift from a mindset of crisis to a one of hope. This is where the true mission begins.

What Makes Missionary Hubs Different?



Mission Over Maintenance Resources flow toward evangelization, not just keeping the lights on. Every decision asks: Does this help us reach outward?

Professional Missionaries Full-time trained staff who can build sustained relationships and coordinate complex ministry partnerships across parish boundaries.

Growth Mindset We're not consolidating—we're expanding into new territory. We're planting, not pruning.

Integrated Mission Schools aren't just schools. Parishes aren't just sacrament factories. Catholic Charities isn't separate. Everything works together to encounter and accompany.


