

Sovereignty Gives Peace in Uncertainty

Hebrews 1:1–3

Big Idea: When you understand that God is sovereign, you stop living in panic and start living at the pace of His peace.

I. God Reveals His Sovereignty Through His Son (1–2)

Key Words

- πολυμερῶς (*polumerōs*) – in many portions
- πολυτρόπως (*polutropōs*) – in many ways
- κόσμους (*kosmous*) – the ages, the created order

Discussion

1. What does progressive revelation teach us about God's faithfulness?

2. Why is it significant that God's final revelation is a Person and not merely a Message?

3. How does knowing Christ is heir of all things challenge fear?

II. God Radiates His Sovereignty Through His Son (3a–b)

Key Words

- ἀπαύγασμα (*apaugasma*) – radiance, shining forth
- χαρακτήρ (*charaktēr*) – exact imprint, precise representation
- φέρων (*pherōn*) – actively carrying, sustaining

Discussion

1. What does it mean that Jesus is the exact imprint of God’s nature?

2. How does Christ’s sustaining power bring stability to your present uncertainty?

3. Where are you tempted to believe God has stepped back instead of leaning in?

III. God Reigns in Sovereignty Through His Son (3c–d)

Key Word

- καθαρισμόν (katharismos) – purification, cleansing

Discussion

1. How does Acts 2:23 deepen your understanding of the cross as sovereign Design?

2. Why does it matter that Jesus “sat down” at the right hand of Majesty?

3. What areas of your life reveal pacing instead of resting?

Application

- Identify one current anxiety. Write it down.
- Place Hebrews 1:3 beside it.
- Pray specifically, surrendering that concern to the One who sustains all things.
