Carry the Cross... With Moments of Reflection

This Lenten season we are reflecting on what it means to carry the cross of discipleship with trust, acceptance, and resolve. This reflection continues on Palm Sunday as we remember Jesus' triumphal entry during His journey toward Jerusalem.

Luke's Gospel tells us that when Jesus reached Bethphage and Bethany and began His descent down the Mount of Olives, celebration erupted. Crowds lifted voices, cloaks covered the road, palms filled the air, and hope shaped every shout:


"Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!"

"Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" (Luke 19:38)

The song of peace and glory sung by angels at Jesus' birth resonated from the people. Even words of rebuke from some Pharisees failed to divert Jesus; His journey continued. The story, however, takes an unexpected turn. As the city of Jerusalem came into view and the roar of the crowd faded behind Him, Jesus entered a moment of reflection...and wept.

This moment matters.

Jesus' tears were not about His fear of the cross or of death. They were tears of One who loved deeply, knew that Jerusalem's rejection would ulti-



mately bring about its destruction, and continued forward anyway for the sake of the world. In this moment of reflection, Jesus held together love, grief, and faithfulness without turning away from any of them. Sorrow received space without gaining control. His purpose remained intact, and His resolve was strengthened.

Part of carrying the cross is allowing moments of reflection to shape our journey, trusting that vulnerability deepens our faith.

Where are we being called to follow Jesus more vulnerably?

What grief or regret have we avoided naming?

What pain have we hurried past instead of prayerfully holding space before God?

Holy Week reminds us that discipleship is not about rushing toward resurrection while skipping the road that leads there. Discipleship is faithfully following Jesus, with moments of reflection that strengthen our resolve to live a resurrected life together.

Donations of plastic eggs and small, wrapped candies are requested. Place the items in the Drop Zone by March 25th.


Helpers are needed on Friday, March 27 at 2 PM to fill and hide the eggs. Teens and adults who would like to help on Saturday are encouraged to sign up.

Aubrey is a Junior at Penn State and is involved in a Christian Fellowship Group there. Her message was, "Is God Safe?" Our newest young adult member, Maddie, led worship on February 15th. We are excited to see our young adults being examples to us all.



FAMILY PROMISE

Calvary's United Women in Faith and Mission Committee are overseeing our Family Promise partnership with Charlton UMC. Family Promise of Harrisburg is a nonprofit organization that helps families experiencing housing instability and homelessness stay together by providing temporary shelter, resources, and support to help them regain stability and secure long-term housing. They utilize a network of local faith communities, volunteers, and professional staff.

Calvary provided meals to Charlton UMC for the families, the week of December 7th. We had congregation members ready to prepare meals for the week of February 9th, but because the family had consistently not followed the covenant they signed they had to find other arrangements. Thank you to those members who had offered to prepare meals for that week and their willingness to sign up for other dates.

We are now looking for meals providers: Wednesday, May 13th and Thursday, May 14th. Our additional dates are the week of August 9th and November 15th. The meals are to be delivered to Charlton between 6:15 and 6:30 PM, ready to eat, no drinks or desserts are necessary. If you cannot provide a meal but would like to donate to Family Promise write a check out to Calvary UMC, and put in the comment section Family Promise.

GOD'S HELPING HANDS

Home Repair Volunteers Needed

God's Helping Hands (GHH) is a faith-based home repair ministry, serving the greater Harrisburg area since 2011 that was founded by Aldersgate United Methodist Church (Mechanicsburg, PA). Their mission is to practice the teachings of Jesus by providing home and property maintenance and repairs for people in need.

In 2025, GHH served 8 homeowners with 154 volunteer work days on a variety of projects, including three ramps.

Projects are typically done over 3-day work weekends, scheduled several times throughout the year. Volunteers of any skill level are always needed and welcome, experience is not required.




SOUL BEATS
