My friend Nate and I have been close since high school. Each summer, when we returned home from college, I would travel with him to visit his grandparents in Michigan. One set of grandparents lived near Detroit, so we would enjoy a Tigers game and explore other activities in the city. Later, we'd head out to the countryside, where the other set of grandparents owned a lake house. These trips became the highlight of my summer break, and even the long drive from North Carolina felt enjoyable thanks to Nate's mixtapes. Back then, before satellite radio and digital music, the mix tape reigned supreme, and Nate spent hours curating the perfect playlists for our road trips.

Music has long been an essential companion for travelers. This Sunday, as we continue our Lenten journey, we'll focus on [Psalm 121](#), one of the fifteen Psalms of Ascent found between Psalms 120 and 134. These songs were sung by pilgrims as they made their way to Jerusalem for religious festivals and observances. They're called "Psalms of Ascent" because the Temple, situated on Mount Zion, required an upward journey, regardless of where the pilgrims began their travels. For those coming from the Jordan Valley, starting at Jericho, the ascent meant climbing about 3,400 feet over an 18-mile stretch. Singing these songs of ascent would have made the challenging journey feel more manageable.

This Sunday, I believe Psalm 121 can also ease our journey, as it reassures us that we have support no matter what we face. I hope you will join us, either in person or online, as we travel together.

This trauma-informed training equips parents, foster families, and social workers with essential knowledge and practical skills to support children impacted by trauma.

- ✓ Insight into why challenging behaviors often reflect adaptive survival responses rather than defiance
- ✓ Skills to create safe, predictable environments that foster healing and secure attachment
- ✓ Practical strategies to support emotional regulation, build trust, and respond to trauma triggers with compassion & consistency
- ✓ Confidence to serve as agents of healing in the lives of vulnerable children
- ✓ Awareness of how to recognize and reduce secondary traumatic stress in themselves and others

First Thursday Lunch - March 5th!



Pastor Steve will guide us using resources from [Lectio 365](#), an online prayer movement devoted to daily prayer and spiritual renewal. Together, we will explore the wisdom of the early desert fathers and mothers, Christians who withdrew into the wilderness and helped shape the life, theology, and spiritual practices of the early church through their rigorous devotion to prayer, Scripture, fasting, and attentiveness to the Holy Spirit.

Lent is a season set apart for reflection, repentance, and renewal. If you sense a need to slow down, deepen your prayer life, or invest more intentionally in your spiritual growth, this study is for you.

We will gather each Wednesday at 6:45 pm in the DUMC Chapel, immediately following Wednesday night dinner.

Come and grow in Christ—and in community—as we journey together toward Easter.

The Leadership Discipleship Experience is a ten-week journey designed to move beyond surface-level faith and into deep, life-changing transformation. Over the course of this experience, you will






