## Call Committee Report

The Call Committee requested an update from Bishop Trish on our search of the Minnesota pastors that the committee had identified as being of high potential interest.

The list originally was 980 pastors which was finally shortened to 27. The latest update from Bishop Trish is that: 1) 7 have declined the opportunity; 2) 1 has not responded; 3) 9 pastors were not allowed to be contacted by the Minnesota Bishop; and 4) 10 pastors Bishop Trish asked permission from the Minnesota Bishop(s) for permission to contact.

The Call process requires that all communication to pastors goes through the Alberta Bishop and then to the other Synod Bishops before it goes to the candidate pastors. Therefore, the Call Committee continues to wait for the Bishops to have their approval.



*The Flock Care Ministry has now completed 22 years of ministry.*

*The ministry continues to carry out visits with congregational members and friends from Lutheran Church of Our Saviour, in seniors' residences, care homes, homebound, those grieving loss or facing other difficult life situations.*

*Small groups within the congregation are always the first choice for caring support, but when that is not possible, we try to keep connections and caring relationships with LCOS.*

*The mission statement is "to facilitate, encourage and ensure caring connections within the church family of LCOS and within the wider community as the need arises."*

*The following members are a part of the visiting team: Pat Farn, Dorothea Schaab, Joanne Stansky, Avril LeBlanc, Linda Trypka, Sylvia Lowen, Beverly Marshall, Judy McDonald, and Anita O'Reilly. Each member visits one or more people, makes phone calls, or meets some other need, as they are willing and able. In 2025 outreach included 20 individuals. We also bring communion to those not able to attend, as an extension of our celebration of the Lords' Supper here at Lutheran Church of Our Saviour.*

*In the last 12 years we have distributed 124 prayer shawls (made by LCOS members and friends) to those experiencing health concerns, or grieving. Earlier this year we were concerned that we were running low on prayer shawls. We put out the word that we were in need. I am happy to report that knitters have responded, and the shawls have been coming in. Even our rental people from Weight Watchers have contributed.*

*Thank you.*

*Ultimately, we hope to create a culture within the church body that will stir each member into noticing, caring, and reaching out to others as we go through those difficult life transitions. I do see this happening on a regular basis.*



## ***Feed the Hungry***

On the third Friday of each month a group of LCOS volunteers serves food to those in need at the Chinook Transit Station.

Volunteers should meet at the church by 3:30 to load food into vehicles to take to the station.

We ask that hot food (stews, soups, casseroles) be packaged in advance in individual sealed containers. A supply of containers is available at the church.

Cold food items (fruit, snack bars, cookies, muffins) and drinks can be dropped off at the church during office hours and should be individually packaged.

A monthly sign up sheet for those wishing to volunteer is located in the Place of Welcome.

Along with food, clothing is accepted throughout the month, and can be dropped off in the Feed the Hungry boxes located by the east entrance of the church. These boxes are specifically labelled and we ask that items be placed in the appropriate box for ease of distribution. Items accepted includes hats, socks, footwear, mittens, blankets, coats, pants and sweaters.



# THE Brenda Strafford CENTRE

The Brenda Strafford Society for the Prevention of Domestic Violence has a mandate to contribute to the creation of a safe community for abused women and their children through quality services and in collaboration with community resources.

The Brenda Strafford Centre provides:

- \* 34 self-contained second stage shelter apartments
- \* 51 self-contained affordable housing units
- \* Individual and group counseling for women and children
- \* Weekly support groups for women and children
- \* Basic Needs Support
- \* Scheduled and Respite Childcare
- \* Follow-up and outreach
- \* Housing referrals
- \* Child & Youth Programs

The centre depends on the generous donations from LCOS to supply their need for new pillows throughout the year. Again this spring LCOS will be accepting donations of new pillows for the Brenda Strafford Centre, as well as new towels, bedding and blankets.


## Library News

## Time Capsule, continued

There are many newspaper articles about the early ministers. Before the Calgary Herald started in 1883, local news was reported occasionally in Winnipeg, Manitoba or Fort Benton, Montana papers. Ministers were usually named in wedding and funeral announcements.

Rev. John McDougall lived at Morley from 1863-1899 and held some Methodist services in Calgary. His father, Rev. George McDougall, died in January 1876 after they had been hunting buffalo for food.

Rev. James Turner the first resident Methodist minister returned to BC in 1884 after a brief stay in Calgary. He lived in some of the mining towns of BC and in the Klondike. Single.

Rev. Joshua Dyke, his second wife and daughter Leila are the people in the 1885 colourized picture in front of the new Methodist parsonage. Rev. Dyke's creative sermon titles were published in the newspaper.

The frame church on Seventh Ave and Street East replaced an earlier log and canvas church partly moved from the east side of the Elbow River to Eighth (Stephen) Ave. Leila died of diphtheria at age 10 in Winnipeg.

Rev. E. Paske Smith (not Smyth), M. A. (Oxford) was sent as a missionary by the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel (SPG). He brought his carpentry tools with him. Made some of the church furniture and helped with the roof of the church at Midnapore. He wanted to be half way between the downtown and Midnapore church members.

E. Paske Smith squatted on land near Heritage Drive east of Fairmount Drive and also bought some CPR land east of Macleod Trail that became the Fairview district. He moved back to England after 5 years and became a military chaplain.

Rev. J. C. Herdman came to Calgary in 1885 from Campbelltown, New Brunswick and was introduced to the congregation of the Presbyterian Church on June 30. His salary was \$396.20 for 1885 (about 6 months). He passed away in Calgary in 1910.

## Bishop's Message



March 2026

Dear family of God,

Why do we exist? (part 2)

Recent events in Minneapolis have provided affirmation of Christian vocation in times of crisis. We are called to always be ready to stand up against unjust practices and to proclaim God's love— sometimes even at great personal risk.

January 23, clergy of multiple denominations gathered in Minneapolis to embody resistance to the presence of ICE officers. The Rt Rev. A. Robert Hirschfeld, Presbyterian Bishop of New Hampshire, advised his clergy to get their affairs in order and have their wills written. Why? Because when we stand up against malevolent forces in the world, things happen.

As we approach the season of Lent, we are reminded that faith calls for personal sacrifice. We willingly give of our finances, our abilities and our time. As Jesus did, we seek to live our lives not for our own sake, but for the benefit of all. When one has more than others, it is shared. When someone needs extra care, we give it. We tithe a portion, recognizing that all we have has been graciously provided by God. These practices are what make our neighbourhoods safer, more equitable and able to thrive as the gaps between us close.

In times like today we are not only asked but are truly being tested to trust in this biblical call. Strategies that undermine universal healthcare or education, politics that hoard resources for one province or country, policies that undermine people because they are different—these are not reflective of Jesus' love for all.

Let's enter into Lent intentionally this year. Let's be mindful of the many who are suffering and in danger, those whose lives are complicated just because of the colour of their skin or where they were born. Let's genuinely seek to learn about those who are different. Let's be generous, active in justice, and let's tell others about Jesus. Let's go to church, rekindle fellowship, pray and sing! Bake cookies for the school in your neighbourhood. Turn off the tv and invite the neighbours for coffee. Use our imaginations and see where the Holy Spirit sparks a new thing!
