Minister's Message

From noon on, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. And about three o'clock Jesus cried with a loud voice, "Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?" that is, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" When some of the bystanders heard it, they said, "This man is calling for Elijah." At once one of them ran and got a sponge, filled it with sour wine, put it on a stick, and gave it to him to drink. But the others said, "Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to save him." Then Jesus cried again with a loud voice and breathed his last.

Siblings in Christ,

It is indeed, as Pratchett says, somehow helpful to curse at God / Fate / the universe in general when something unfortunate happens. The idea that we have somehow been targeted is strangely more comforting than the idea that the world doesn't care one way or another.

This is the instinct behind the Judeo-Christian tradition of lamentation. Sometimes we get the idea that it is unfaithful or deeply sinful to be angry at God, to accuse God of not caring, or even to complain to God. But the opposite is true. We even have an entire book of the Bible (Lamentations) devoted to it. To complain to God is to trust that God cares, that God is involved in our lives, even if we have the idea that God may somehow be complicit in our suffering (which is not a claim I am making).

But this is why Good Friday is important. Even Jesus cries out to God. Even Jesus feels afraid and abandoned. To feel afraid and abandoned in our deepest moments is deeply human, and Good Friday tells us that while this is a human experience, God is never absent from us. Indeed, the Incarnation says that God does not abandon us; God is right there beside us on whatever Cross we are experiencing. Have a blessed Easter, and know that you are never alone.
