The Cross Matters

Welcome to Lent!

Obviously the cross is central to who we are as Christians, and the cross plays an important role in Jesus' story of suffering during Lent. However, it's important to remember that we don't arrive at the cross where Jesus is crucified until Good Friday.

It's amazing how those few hours on a cross can upend the entire world!

During our regular weekend worship services, we will spend the season of Lent hearing stories of Jesus pointing to and bringing about new life. Whether its new life that comes from being born again of water and the spirit, or the waters of new life that come forth from the living well, or being cured of illnesses, or being raised from the dead like Lazarus, Jesus' life in this world pointed to something greater than the world could ever provide.

During our midweek Lenten worship services, we will focus on the cross. And, in particular, we will focus on the recorded words that Jesus spoke from the cross. Traditionally these are called Jesus' Seven Last Words - seven phrases recorded across the four gospels of what Jesus spoke as he was hanging crucified on the cross. On the surface these sound like words spoken out of torment and pain. But once we dig into them, we begin to see how these phrases become promises of hope and new life.

And isn't that what Lent is about? Digging through the messiness and pain of this world in order to discover the promise of hope and new life that God has given to us and to all?

I hope that you will join us in this journey!

FEBRUARY HOPE5ONE UPDATE

How is Hope5one?

I get asked that question often and, often, I am amazed at how Hope5one is really doing. Just as seasons change throughout each year involving growth, blossoms, and fruit that become more visible during specific seasons, we can report similar growth and progress at Hope5one.

After several recent changes in our board of directors (related to life changes on their end), we once again have a full board of nine members. Richard DeFord (now president), Laura Bauml (treasurer), Cammie Beam (secretary), Jeannie Christian, and Lori Yelton continue to serve on our board. Joe Wilde has joined our ranks bringing with him business know-how, and we have already put him to work analyzing our data and helping us gather important statistics for future organizational sustainability. Chad Eledge (now also vice president) brings with him rich experience in law enforcement, military service, crisis intervention, and child protective services. He is our go-to guy for many ques-

tions we have related to these areas of our mission. Patty Kinkead, a nurse practitioner who has served in immigrant and military veteran settings, among many others, comes to us with a willingness to add her healthcare expertise to our direct care opportunities for survivors now and in the future at Hope House. Chuck Hagedorn, a certified nurse anesthetist, brings his professional desire to see Hope5one grow in ways he has experienced while serving on other non-profit boards. His love for golf will be helpful in planning future events (hint, hint).

As a director, I am so blessed to have such a supportive, active board of directors!! Hope5one is privileged to have them at the helm!

Throughout the past year, we have gained valuable insight by walking alongside survivors who have been able to obtain housing in this local area and have needed a little extra care and support to work toward the next steps in their healing journeys.

This activity and experience show us repeatedly how necessary our Hope House program is!

Speaking of Hope House, “How is that progress going?” you may ask. After the building team visited with three builders to get bids for getting to a roughed-in, sheet rocked-in, and heated and cooled stopping point with Hope House, we realized we are not quite to the point in our building campaign goal to be able say, “Put us on your schedule for 2026!” The land has been cleared, a septic engineer has been hired, and we pray for quick solutions to this financial need so we can get the building process underway. We already have had professional labor donated and have received some discounts. We know this has been, and will be, a valuable part of the building progress!

So, yes, Hope5one is growing, budding, and blossoming. And you are a part of that as you offer your support and encouragement and help us complete the mission of Hope5one. Although you may just not see all of it happening every single moment of every day, there is always po-

tential and there is always progress! So much can change with the ring of a phone or the arrival of an envelope. Thank you for being involved with Hope5one, walking faithfully with us in each season we experience. We look forward to what might bloom with the next miracle God has for us! --




