Session 1 Workshops:

Bringing the ELCA Social Statement on Civic Life and Faith to your Congregation

with Dr. Stewart Herman — Downstairs Auditorium

The ELCA Churchwide Assembly 2025 has adopted a social statement on faith and civic life, the relationship of religious organizations and political authority, and related matters. Social statements are the ELCA's primary documents to address significant social issues. They are intended to aid reflection, shape conscience and set forth the ELCA's teaching and policy on the major social issues and questions of contemporary life. Join Dr. Stuart Herman to learn about this social statement and how you might engage with it in your congregation for meaningful dialogue about this topic.

Church council leaders serve with faithfulness, creativity and courage. The role of president can be particularly challenging – and rewarding! Led by current and past council presidents, this workshop will provide you with an overview of best practices for presidents. Come to learn and share ideas!

Disability & Ministry *with Deacon Amanda Sabelko — Sanctuary (main level)*

Ministry with people living with disabilities is essential work, but too often treated as optional. 1 in 4 people experience a disability at any given moment, and almost everyone will experience disability during their lifetime. In this workshop, you learn about the importance of this work and leave with practical action steps.

Reaching the Goldfish *with Ashley Corbett — Room 133 (downstairs)*

In case you didn't know, the attention span of a goldfish is 9 seconds. The average human attention span is shorter. (And getting shorter.) Which makes it really hard to reach our people. (And getting harder.) We will look at what we know about human nature and explore different ways to share effectively. You won't walk away with all the answers, but with new ideas and strategies to reach the goldfish (I mean people!).

Taking Excellent Care: Faithful Finances for Courageous Councils *with Rev. Emily Carson — Chapel Room 248*

A steward is one who takes excellent care of what has been entrusted to them. In this workshop, council leaders and treasurers (and any interested pastors, deacons and lay leaders) will explore financial best practices and stewardship strategies.

Participants will gain tools, language, and confidence to lead congregational financial ministries with integrity, transparency, and hope - ensuring that resources are aligned with ministry, mission and values.
