

# EVENT #2: EXODUS



<sup>3</sup> So Moses said to the people, “This is a day to remember forever—**the day you left Egypt, the place of your slavery.** Today the LORD has brought you out by the power of his mighty hand. (Remember, eat no food containing yeast.) <sup>4</sup> On this day in early spring, in the month of Abib, you have been **set free.**



# What are we saved from?

- **Brokenness** – something is fundamentally wrong within us and within the world.
- **Rebellion** – a refusal, whether conscious or unconscious, to submit to God's rule.
- **Separation** – it creates distance from God, who is understood as holy.
- **Bondage** – it enslaves, shaping habits, speech, thought patterns, and identity.




