

**Pacific Growth Group – Sermon Questions**

**Week of March 8<sup>th</sup>, 2026**

**Sermon Theme: “A Harvest of Righteousness”**

**Primary Text(s): 2 Corinthians 9:6-15**

1. In 2 Corinthians 9:6–15, Paul connects giving with the idea of sowing and harvesting.
  - a. *What do you think it means to “sow generously,” and how have you seen small acts of faithfulness grow into something larger over time?*
  
2. The passage emphasizes giving cheerfully rather than out of pressure or obligation.
  - a. *What do you think the difference is between giving out of duty and giving out of genuine motivation?*
  
3. Righteousness in Scripture is both relational (right with God) and about character (becoming more like Him).
  - a. *How have you experienced God shaping your character over time through everyday obedience?*
  
4. The sermon mentioned the idea of “personal obedience;” the specific thing God might be asking you to do right now.
  - a. *Can you think of a moment when you sensed God prompting you to take a small step of obedience?*
  
5. The metaphor of planting seeds suggests that what begins small can lead to a harvest later.
  - a. *What are some “small seeds” in the Christian life (habits of: prayers, generosity, acts of love) that can lead to long-term spiritual growth?*
  
6. The example of the widow’s offering (Mark 12:41–44) shows that God values faithfulness more than the size of the gift.
  - a. *What does that story teach us about how God sees our acts of obedience?*
  
7. The message suggested that daily “yeses” to God can compound over time, like compound interest.
  - a. *What might one small step of obedience look like for you this week?*
