The Power Factor

I. The Promise (1-2)

Paul identifies himself as servant messenger.

II. The Person (3-4)

The resurrection of Jesus marked the beginning of His reign as Son of God with power.

III. The Purpose (5-6)

Our callings are from, and for the glory of, Christ Jesus.

The One I'm called to serve is reigning in power right now!

1. Read Romans 1:1-6. How does Paul identify himself in verses 1 & 2? What does he say about his message in verses 1 & 2?

2. Paul says two very significant things about Jesus, one in verse 3 and the other in verse 4. What are they, and why is each significant?

Why is each important for you to know?

Give one or more examples of how each is, or can be, helpful to you.

3. In verses 5 & 6 Paul goes back to his calling. What does he say His calling is, and the purpose of it, in verse 5?

What does "for His name's sake" mean in verse 5?

What is God's calling in your life?

In what ways is your calling similar, and different, to Paul's?

4. If Jesus called you to serve Him, and He's reigning in power right now, what difference should that make in how you serve Him?
