

Small Group Bible Study Questions. Sermon by Pastor Cam Dailly. March 15'26: "I Thirst" John 19:28-29

From Brendan: "These questions are a guide. You do not have to use every question. Knowing your group, go over these questions and ask God what questions you should focus on. May God bless and guide your discussions!"

- Welcome everyone and open with prayer. **Optional:** *take communion together!*

Icebreaker Question:

- What's a moment you remember being really thirsty (after sports, hiking, travel, etc.)? What made it memorable?

Follow-up from last week:

- How did practicing self-giving love, forgiveness, or humility within the household of God go last week?

Read John 19:25-27

- What details stand out to you in this short moment during the crucifixion?
- The sermon highlights that Jesus' thirst displays his humanity. Why do you think it matters for our faith that Jesus experienced real human weakness and suffering?
- The message also emphasized that Jesus' words fulfill Scripture and reveal his identity. What does this moment show us about who Jesus is and what he understood about his mission?
- Sometimes we can treat Jesus as distant or superhuman. How does seeing Jesus in such a vulnerable moment change the way you relate to him?
- In the sermon, Jesus' thirst ultimately points to giving water to the thirsty. Where do you see spiritual thirst' in people around you—or even in your own life?

Life Application:

- If Jesus came to satisfy the deepest thirst of humanity, what might it look like this week for you to drink from Christ?
 - Or for you to point someone toward that living water in a practical way?
- ... Drink and give others this spiritual water!
