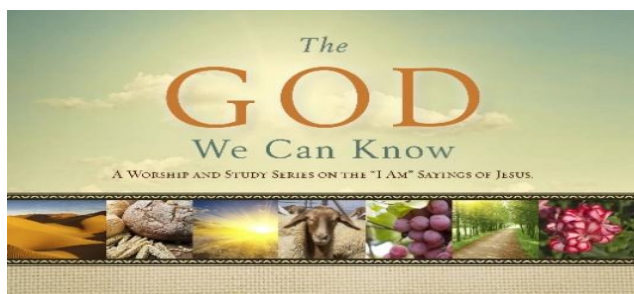

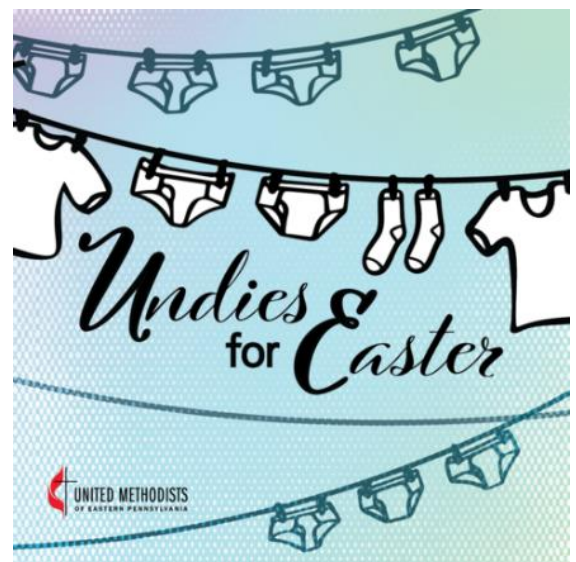


UDPATE! Undies for Easter

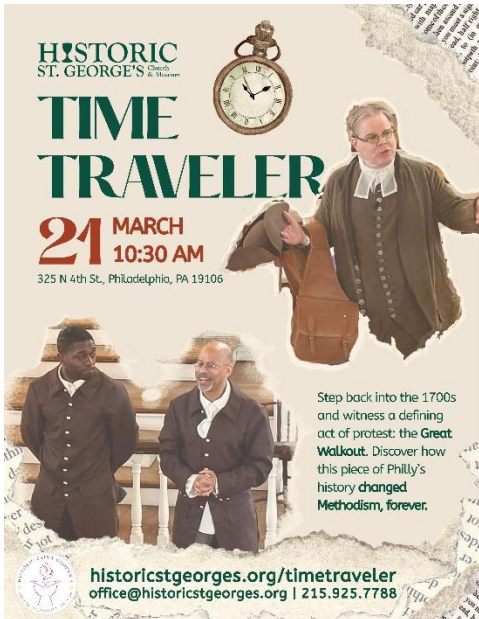

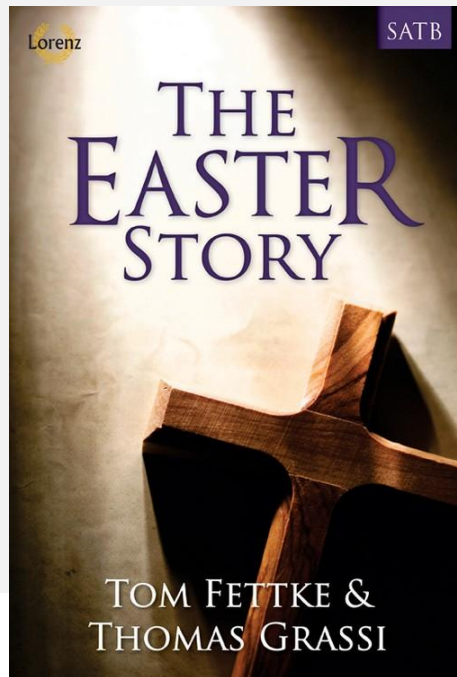


DR. JOHN D. BLAIR SCHOLARSHIPS
