The Big Idea: Christians were not created to practice Christianity alone, rather we were made to glorify God together in one accord, keeping God the ultimate center of our adoration. Similarly, in Psalm 134, the Psalmist commands us to give all honor, glory, and praise to the Lord of heaven and earth.

Psalm 133 (ESV)

Behold, how good and pleasant it is when brothers dwell in unity! ²It is like the precious oil on the head, running down on the beard, on the beard of Aaron, running down on the collar of his robes! ³It is like the dew of Hermon, which falls on the mountains of Zion! For there the Lord has commanded the blessing, life forevermore.
