## We Begin with Testimonies

### Preamble for Today's Lesson

#### **Proverbs 14:15-16 (Amp)**

The simpleton believes every word he hears, but the prudent man looks *and* considers well where he is going.

A wise man suspects danger and cautiously avoids evil, but the fool bears himself insolently and is [presumptuously] confident.

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#### **Today's Topic: "The Financial Road Ahead, What to Know"**

*(Preparing for the Startling That May Soon Be Upon Us)*

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#### **Hebrews 13:5-6**

Let your character *or* moral disposition be free from love of money [including greed, avarice, lust, and craving for earthly possessions] and be satisfied with your present [circumstances and with what you have]; for He [God] Himself has said, I will not in any way fail you *nor* give you up *nor* leave you without support. [I will] not, [I will] not, [I will] not in any degree leave you helpless *nor* forsake *nor* let [you] down (relax My hold on you)! [Assuredly not!]

So, we take comfort *and* are encouraged *and* confidently *and* boldly say, The Lord is my Helper; I will not be seized with alarm [I will not fear or dread or be terrified]. What can man do to me?

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## Let's Revisit Matthew 25

**Matthew 25, as stated in our last meeting, is a dissertation by Jesus (in parable form) that is all about money, as seen through the lens of heaven.**

Why?

**As we said before; because in Heaven money is not the thing . . . on earth money is the thing, and I think Jesus wanted to correct that notion.**

I believe Jesus's dissertation in Matthew 25 was / is showing everyone who has ears to hear, as to what they can expect on God's Final Exam . . . and guess what, money and our personal finances were in the center of that dissertation. So, let's unpack that a bit.

It was always God's design for His Kingdom to expand, here on planet earth, with mankind's participation in that event. That Kingdom expansion has not stopped, and it continues on.

However, Souls in the Kingdom, not money in the bank, was always God's objective.

As such, Jesus showed us in Matthew 25 that it all begins with an intimate relationship with Him, and when that is established, the next test is good stewardship of what the Lord Has put in our hands, and then lastly, the call to attend to the least of these, using that which the Lord has prospered you in, to serve the less fortunate.

**When We Ge Nervous About Our Financial Condition; What was Jesus' command to us all?**

### Matthew 6:33

**But seek (aim at and strive after) first of all His kingdom and His righteousness (His way of doing and being right), and then all these things taken together will be given you besides.**

In reality, what do we need to now do to witness the manifestation of this Scripture, in our lives . . . and why is this so important for today?

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**Addressing the last question first;** we are closer to the end of this age than many of us now realize. With that said, we may soon witness things that we have not experienced before, and some of those things may be unsettling. When those types of things take place, it can have the effect of causing alarm to rise within us, moving us closer to a state of fear. When we are in a state of fear, some of the things we have been taught, can go out the window when we go into a “fight or flight” state of mind.

**So, with that said, what do we need to now do, to witness the manifestation of this Scripture (Matthew 6:33), in our life?** First, our adoption of the bedrock truth, of this specific Scripture in our personal life. Second, impeach all limiting beliefs, and we do that by taking every thought captive (2 Corinthians 10:5) that sets itself up against the true knowledge of God. That is our part.

## **Why this topic now?**

As we begin to understand the Biblical timeline for the end of the age, as noted in Revelation 6, Pastor Steve Cioccolanti has made the case in his recent book; *The Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse*, that the white horse has galloped, and the red horse is now galloping, and the black horse will start to gallop, if he is correct, the end of this calendar year. Something to consider.

What about timing for changes to take place . . . like the second coming of Jesus, we actually don't know.

## **Matthew 24:36-37 (Amp)**

**But about that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son,<sup>[a]</sup> but only the Father. As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man.**

How might we begin, in reorienting ourselves towards Biblical truth about the Good Lord taking care of us, now and in the days ahead? **A Part of this Begins with Our Understanding regarding Our Own False Beliefs.**

*“Your beliefs and self-talk are what truly makes you who you are, affects how you move through the world, and influences the results you’re getting when it comes to human outcomes. No amount of internet resources and articles about body language, leadership, confidence, or social skills has the capacity to change you if the beliefs and self-talk that run the show, are still in power.”*

*“Your beliefs have tremendous power – largely because they go unnoticed, and it’s simply assumed that their power and control over you are part of your life. **The moment you are able to locate, identify, and understand them, you place your hand on to a steering wheel that has been left unattended throughout your life.**”*

**Consequently, we should ask ourselves;** what am I believing, about myself, for my financial future?

**And while we are at it, a second question;** what small practical steps can I take in my own life to improve upon, being a good and faithful servant, of what the Lord has put in my hands?

The truth be told, everybody currently has an ingredient in their hands, something to start with, even though it may seem very small.

This new thought process and action plan becomes a journey, not a destination, in our life. And as we move forward, we will witness God’s faithfulness, more and more.

And when we go down this road, we rely on the Goodness and Faithfulness of the Lord, making our well-being, his responsibility . . . and I think, He always intended it to be that way, but we got in the way of that plan by doing our own thing, and being enticed by the Babylonian Financial System.

I sense we are all now being called back into the secure embrace of our Heavenly Father, for such a time as this.

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## Last Question:

Will we then be the prudent man the Scripture spoke about and consider well where we are now going?

**So, with that said, I want to close with a Scripture that was highlighted to my, by Holy Spirit:**

### Jeremiah 17:5-8 (Amp)

Thus says the Lord: Cursed [with great evil] is the strong man who trusts in *and* relies on frail man, making weak [human] flesh his arm, and whose mind *and* heart turn aside from the Lord.

For he shall be like a shrub *or* a person naked and destitute in the desert; and he shall not see any good come, but shall dwell in the parched places in the wilderness, in an uninhabited salt land.

[Most] blessed is the man who believes in, trusts in, *and* relies on the Lord, and whose hope *and* confidence the Lord is.

For he shall be like a tree planted by the waters that spreads out its roots by the river; and it shall not see *and* fear when heat comes; but its leaf shall be green. It shall not be anxious *and* full of care in the year of drought, nor shall it cease yielding fruit.
