Dear Friends,

These past three months have gone by very quickly. We have such a need for your prayers. God wants to win a spiritual battle in this mission field. Sometimes I feel like Moses trying to convince Pharaoh to let God's people go. God encouraged His servant with "I am the LORD." I have been realizing more and more how much of missions is standing with God and for God and waiting on Him until Satan flees.

## Discipleship Opportunities

When we moved to Nagykanizsa seven months ago, one of our main goals was to encourage and equip existing believers here to accomplish the Great Commission. I think the opportunity for that has exceeded my original expectations.

We now have evangelistic relationships with the friends of two different ladies in this group. Ica invited her friend, Eva, to the Sunday meeting several weeks ago. Eva is a recovering alcoholic and was very tender toward the Gospel. She has been laid up at home for a few weeks now, but wants to come with Ica to our home again as soon as she is able to.

Kata is one of the teachers at the high school where our friend Anikó also teaches. I know many of you have been praying for her. She attended the last ladies' Bible study we held, and is planning to come this Sunday to our service. Kata, like many people, has almost no knowledge of the Bible or Christianity. Her heart is very tender right now, and I believe God will do something special with her life.

We have also had some really special ministry opportunities with a mother (Rami) from Katie's preschool. She's been to our home, and we meet at a nearby playground sometimes. She has many needs, so pray as we share how Jesus has all the answers and hope.

## Young People

Sarah continues to deepen her spiritual relationship with a teen girl, who may not be saved yet. God is definitely at work in her family, and they are in great need of prayer right now.

Although both the principal and vice-principal at the high school were supportive of our youth meeting, the State denied their request for us to hold an English youth meeting/Bible study at the school. There is a major election next month (April), and they are trying to avoid any involvement with the school system in politics or religion. There might be an opportunity later on. In lieu of this, we will be starting the group in our home in the weeks ahead, Lord willing. Please pray that God would give us the right group of young people.

We continue to have opportunities to speak about the Lord and our personal testimonies in the high school. One of the 9th-grade teachers is having me lead class discussions on the topic of the American system of

government. This has provided some neat opportunities to contrast the secular humanism of Europe with a system based on a biblical worldview.

The State is still processing our application to hold a Bible club at the children's home. It is apparently a long process. I have called here and there to see how the process is going, and it is still in process.

### Our Home

We put our home in Nyíregyháza up on the market last May. We still have not sold it, even though I have lowered the price several times and originally asked the realtor to price it to sell. This has created a number of difficulties for us. The owner of the house we are renting in Nagykanizsa has decided to sell the property. He will honor our rental contract through the end of August, but we will either need to find somewhere else to live or buy this house from him. It is roughly the same price as our apartment in Nyíregyháza, so it wouldn't be a problem to buy it if we sell our other home. There are about four other potential buyers for it, since it is the only property in this price range and quality in the area. Right now, there are literally no other rental properties in the town here that would work for us. Very few people rent property here to begin with, and house rentals (as opposed to apartments) are very rare. Our home is also our ministry place right now, and a small apartment would make that very difficult. We appreciate your prayers for this. I still believe God wanted us to move here when we did, and we are just trusting Him to work out those details.
