SUNDAY REFLECTION — Growth That Brings God Glory

Week Focus: When Growth Becomes Visible

Scripture- John 15:8

“This is to my Father’s glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples.”

Devotional Reflection

Take a moment and reflect on this past week. Consider what God has been doing—not just around you, but within you. Growth is not always something you notice in the moment, but when you pause and look back, you begin to see the evidence. What once felt uncertain may now feel clearer, and what once felt difficult may now feel more manageable.
