Staying Focused on the Resurrection

Easter is upon us, and after a full day of worship services, candy, and family gatherings, it will be over. The fact that Jesus is alive, however, will continue to be true and will carry us through everything we face.

Consider this verse:

1 Corinthians 15:14 “And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith.”

Why is the resurrection such a big deal? It is the very foundation of our faith as Christians. This miracle turned the fearful and hopeless disciples who fled and hid during the crucifixion, into the courageous bearers of the gospel who would not deny the risen Lord even when faced with death. Hundreds of eye witnesses, physical evidence, and the transformation of even the skeptics of the day have fueled the generational world-wide movement of Jesus. That movement is alive and well and new believers continue to be added to the family of God. We have the privilege of being heirs with Christ and part of the movement of the kingdom of God that offers hope and healing.

What does it mean for us that we have a risen Savior? One of our hymns describes it this way, “Because he lives, I can face tomorrow; because he lives, all fear is gone; because I know he holds the future, and life is worth the living



just because he lives.” Jesus has defeated death. We have been raised with Christ. That means he lives in us and we can have new life. This is everything! This is what makes us a light on a hill in this dark world.



SPECIAL OFFERING ENVELOPES THIS MONTH

Green Building Fund Envelope – every month there is an envelope for contributions to our Building Fund which are used to reduce the principal on Calvary's mortgage, which we pay quarterly. The current balance of our mortgage is \$689,000.

Pink Mission Envelope #3 – This envelope is in your box dated April 12th and will benefit the Cupboard at Calvary. The Cupboard is our own food pantry. We are affiliated with the Central Pennsylvania Food Bank and serve 17109, 17111, and 17112 zip codes. The pantry is open for residents of our service area on the 2nd and 4th Thursday of each month from 4-6 PM. Your contribution will help feed dozens of our neighbors.

Native American Ministries – Funds collected in this grey envelope will be forwarded to our denomination to support Native Americans across the country with outreach to Native American pastors and congregations and scholarships for Native American seminary students. The envelope is in your box for April 26th.

CONGREGATIONAL CARE

What is Stephen's Ministry?

A Stephen Minister is a Christian Congregation member with gifts of caregiving who has received 50 hours of training in providing emotional and spiritual care and who is committed to "being there" for a person in need. Ministers listen, explore feelings, pray, and facilitate the healing process. All aspects of the care relationship are confidential. If you are feeling a call to this ministry or are facing a difficult time in your life and could use the extra support, please reach out to Pastor Doug.

Who will visit me if I have a hospital stay?

It is important to remember that the hospital does not notify us you are there. You can let the church office know you are at the hospital or ask the hospital chaplain's office for assistance in getting a message to us. Once we receive the notification, Pastor Deb and Pastor Randy are in communication to determine who is able to see you at the earliest possible time and we contact Pastor Doug if neither of us are available. We are then in communication with each other regarding follow-up needs and prayer requests. So, you may see any one of us in your time in a hospital, rehab center, or in your home.

How does the prayer list work?

People are added to the prayer list by request. We do not add any church member or share any details of any situation without permission of that individual. While we receive many prayer requests, we rarely know when someone should come off of the prayer list. It is our policy to update our prayer list on a monthly basis. This means we remove all names except those who have requested to be on the prayer list again. We are happy to add any names back that are in need of continued prayer.



FAMILY PROMISE

Calvary's United Women in Faith and Mission Committee are overseeing our Family Promise partnership with Charlton UMC. Family Promise of Harrisburg is a nonprofit organization that helps **families** experiencing housing instability and homelessness stay together by providing temporary shelter, resources, and support to help them regain stability and secure long-term housing. They utilize a network of local faith communities, volunteers, and professional staff.

Calvary provided meals to Charlton UMC for the families, the week of December 7th. We had congregation members ready to prepare meals for the week of February 9th, but because the family had consistently not followed the covenant they signed they had to find other arrangements. Thank you to those members who had offered to prepare meals for that week and their willingness to sign up for other dates.

Thank you to everyone who volunteered for our May dates. Our additional dates are the week of August 9th and November 15th. The meals are to be delivered to Charlton between 6:15 and 6:30 PM, ready to eat, no drinks or desserts are necessary. If you cannot provide a meal but would like to donate to Family Promise write a check out to Calvary UMC, and put in the comment section Family Promise.

GOD'S HELPING HANDS

Home Repair Volunteers Needed

God's Helping Hands (GHH) is a faith-based home repair ministry, serving the greater Harrisburg area since 2011 that was founded by Aldersgate United Methodist Church (Mechanicsburg, PA). Their mission is to practice the teachings of Jesus by providing home and property maintenance and repairs for people in need.

In 2025, GHH served 8 homeowners with 154 volunteer work days on a variety of projects, including three ramps.

Projects are typically done over 3-day work weekends, scheduled several times throughout the year. Volunteers of any skill level are always needed and welcome, experience is not required.



RECYCLING AT CALVARY

If you ever place recyclable items in our Recycling Dumpster, please be sure to read this notice:

Reminder! NO plastic bags may be placed in Calvary's Recycling Dumpster. There are fines from the recycling site where our trash haulers deliver our recyclables which our hauler will pass on to the church if plastic bags are in the container. There are cameras on the trucks to monitor what is in our container and we will be fined \$165 if there are plastic bags, even just one.

If you are taking recyclables out to the dumpster you must place the items so that they are loose in the dumpster and not within a plastic bag. Allowable recyclables are: newspaper, cardboard (boxes must be broken down), glass jars or bottles, aluminum & tin cans, hard plastic bottles, jugs & jars (#'s 1, 2 or 5 only). The Missions Committee is pleased to provide Butterfly Presents to several organizations this spring. The gifts provided will benefit the following:

Calvary Kids Day Care is a non-profit Christian childcare center that strives for a family-like environment. Calvary Kids serves children ages 6 weeks to 5 years with a Before and After School Program as well as a School Age Summer Camp.

Harrisburg Area Police Athletic/Activities League (HAPAL) provides youth initiatives and activities throughout the year. Mentoring through Sports and Life Learners are the main initiatives from which all programs/activities stem. HAPAL Sports' instruction centers on positive mentoring, education, character development, positive values, diversity, and responsible behavior. The Life Learners Initiative is at the core of all programs/activities offered by HAPAL, along with the goal of bridging the gaps between our mentees and law enforcement in hopes of reducing crime and recidivism in our communities.

Paxton Ministries provides affordable housing and support services to adults in need with Christ-like love. They care for adults challenged with poverty, mental illness, and intellectual disabilities. Their housing options offer a safe, comfortable, and supportive home where adults in need are treated with dignity and respect and where each person's unique gifts are celebrated. By working together as a family of residents, staff, volunteers, supporters,

and community partners, they strive to provide housing, help, and healing in the name of Christ.

Silence of Mary Home located in Lemoyne serves the mentally ill, the terminally ill, expectant mothers, babies, children, students who need tutoring, teenagers and adults in crisis, the elderly, the poor, the homeless, the disadvantaged, refugees, and immigrants. In the past they have provided shelter and tutoring to adults, teens and youngsters. Now they have been tasked with other urgent objectives such as food, hygiene items, clothing, help with housing, local schools' backpack programs, math tutoring, and other necessities.

Wesley Forest Camp and Retreat Center is one of three camps operated by the Susquehanna Conference of the United Methodist Church. Their year-round facilities offer the perfect setting for a memorable week-long retreat, weekend event, or day-long gathering. During the summer, they operate as a resident Christian summer camp. Children, youth, and persons with special needs spend a memorable week or more in one of their exciting summer camp programs. Wesley Forest has been providing relevant and relational Christian, educational, non-profit, and volunteer programs since 1961.

Why a Butterfly? Butterflies represent the transformation the Christian faith can lead to, through the grace of God.

To help support these organizations, pick up Butterflies beginning Sunday, April 12th, purchase the gifts listed and return them unwrapped to the appropriate tree with the Butterfly attached by Sunday, May 3rd. If you are unable to pick up Butterflies and would still like to donate you may send a check written out to the specific mission you want to donate to and mail to the church by Sunday, May 3rd.
