

Summary

Pastor Paul addresses the insidious nature of sexual immorality and how small, seemingly harmless actions can have profound negative impacts over time. Using a physics analogy comparing a baseball and bullet to demonstrate how quantity and frequency matter more than immediate size or impact, he explains that repeated misuses of sexuality cause widespread damage to hearts, minds, and relationships. Paul calls the church to be truth-tellers who expose lies and walk as children of light, emphasizing that Christians must do the hard work of studying and thinking critically to distinguish truth from deception in our culture.

Questions

1. How does Paul's call to 'be imitators of God as beloved children' relate to how we handle sexuality and purity in our lives?
2. What does it mean that we were 'once darkness, but now in the Lord you are light'? How should this identity change how we live?
3. The pastor used a physics analogy about kinetic energy to explain how small things can have big impacts. Can you think of examples in your own life where small, repeated actions led to significant consequences?

4. Paul says to 'take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness, rather expose them.' How can we do this in a loving, Christ-like way without being judgmental?
5. What are some 'empty words' or lies that our culture tells us about sexuality and relationships? How can we discern truth from deception?
6. How can we 'walk as children of light' in practical ways when it comes to our speech, entertainment choices, and relationships?
7. What does it mean to be 'filled with the Spirit' rather than being controlled by worldly desires? How does this play out in daily life?
8. How can the church community help each other 'iron sharpens iron' when it comes to living out biblical truth in difficult areas like sexuality?

Life Application

This week, identify one area where you've been influenced by cultural lies rather than biblical truth. Commit to studying what God's Word actually says about this topic and ask a trusted Christian friend to help hold you accountable to living according to God's truth rather than cultural opinion.
