Grace, peace, and mercy to you all.

“For now the winter is past, the rain is over and gone. The flowers appear on the earth; the time of singing has come, and the voice of the turtledove is heard in our land.”

Song of Songs 2:11-12

As the long, gray days of winter begin to loosen their grip, we find ourselves once again standing on the threshold of Easter. It is a season that speaks not only to our faith, but to the very rhythms of creation itself. Step outside and you can see it: the quiet, persistent signs of new life. Buds swell on branches that once seemed lifeless. Crocuses and daffodils push their way through cold soil. The earth itself seems to breathe again.

Easter arrives in harmony with this unfolding world. It is not by accident that we celebrate resurrection as the ground thaws and the days lengthen. The story of Christ's rising is echoed in every green shoot and blossoming tree. What once appeared barren is alive again. What seemed lost is restored. Death does not have the final word. And yet, Easter does not ignore the reality of what came before. The beauty of spring does not deny the harshness of winter, rather it emerges through it. In the same way, the joy of Easter is not a dismissal of Good Friday. The empty tomb does not erase the cross; it transforms it. We carry with us the truth that life is often marked by seasons of grief, uncertainty, and waiting. We know what it is to walk through winters of the soul.

That is what makes Easter so profoundly meaningful. It is not a shallow optimism or a simple turning of the calendar. It is a deep, abiding promise: that God meets us in the places we thought were beyond hope and brings forth life. Resurrection is not just something that happened to Jesus long ago. It is something God continues to work in us and among us even now.

As we enter this Easter season, we are invited to pay attention. Where do we see signs of new life around us? Perhaps it is in nature, the first blossoms on a tree or the return of birdsong in the morning. But perhaps it is also in quieter, more personal ways: a mended relationship, a renewed sense of purpose, a moment of unexpected peace. Easter calls us to trust that even in the places that feel closed off or buried, God is at work. Seeds do not bloom overnight. Resurrection often begins unseen, beneath the surface, in ways we do not immediately recognize. But slowly, faithfully, new life emerges.

So, as you walk through these spring days, take a moment to notice what is growing, both around you and within you. Let the beauty of creation be a reminder of God's ongoing work of renewal.

And consider this question for reflection:

Where in your life might God be bringing new life, even if you cannot fully see it yet?

May this Easter season fill you with hope, grounded not in denial of life's realities, but in the enduring promise that love, life, and grace will have the final word.

President's Message

Thank you! Thank you! Thank you! The **Freedom to Serve** campaign is off to a fantastic start. Prior to the kickoff dinner on Sunday, March 15th, a total of \$63,200 was donated to the campaign. At the dinner an additional \$52,830 was committed to the campaign by August 1st for a total of \$116,030. An additional \$32,000 was pledged at the kickoff dinner that will come in subsequent years of the campaign. The overall total pledged to the campaign to date is \$148,030.

Why is the amount committed to the campaign important by August 1st? ADLC currently has a 7-year variable interest loan on our mortgage that is due to be renewed in August of 2026. We currently have an interest rate of 4.875%. With the rise in interest rates, it is projected that when the loan is refinanced our new rate will be 7.05%. If we don't make any downpayment on our balance at the time of refinancing our yearly increase cost to our budget will be around \$7,700. With the current amount committed by August 1st it is projected that we would have a savings to the budget around \$6,500. If we raise \$150,000 by August 1st the savings would be \$13,500. If we raise \$175,000, the savings would be \$17,100. So, the more we raise the more we can free up to serve our current or future ministries.

The next phase in the campaign is conducting the house meetings. The campaign team is currently soliciting people who will host the meetings for 8 to 10 people. Hosts will need to provide light refreshments for the meetings. The campaign team will facilitate the discussions at the meetings. Once hosts are identified, sign-up sheets will be posted in the narthex for you to sign up for the meeting you would like to attend. **I encourage everyone to attend one of the house meetings even if you have already supported the campaign, will support it in the future, or are unable provide financial support. The campaign team members would like to hear your dreams and wishes for our current ministries and possible future ministries. Additionally, it will be a great opportunity to get to know your fellow members.**

On even years the Southwestern Washington Synod conducts an Educational Gathering. This year's theme is **Stewardship: Funding Ministry for Today and the Future**. The Keynote Speaker is Grace Pomroy from Luther Seminary. The breakout sessions include: *Grant Writing, Bible Study, Land Use Discernment, Stewardship Models*, and more to be announced. Lunch is included. Cost is \$50/person. Congregations can send as many interested people as they desire. The meetings are on June 13th at Christ Lutheran Church, Lakewood, WA, or on May 30th at Messiah Lutheran Church, Vancouver, WA. Registration has opened. Let Cindy Beals know if you are interested in attending. ADLC will cover the costs for people that attend.

Highlights from the March Council Meeting:

- ◇ Reviewed the Little Lambs financials (July 1st – February 28th). Income in excess of expenses was \$23,867 with reserve funds of \$64,868. Note: Much of the reserve funds are used to pay expenses (salaries) during the summer when school is out.
- ◇ Accepted reports from the Council Committee Liaisons and acted as necessary to requests.
- ◇ Fiscal Year 2026—27 is off to a good start with a net operating income of \$8,659 in February. **Please review the complete financial report on the following page.**
- ◇ Approved a motion to move the current debt reduction funds from the Freedom to Serve campaign to the MIF Demand Investment Account and any future funds where they will receive a higher interest rate until the refinance on August 1, 2026.
- ◇ Approved a motion to pay the remaining expenses for the Freedom to Serve campaign from the remaining funds in the Sanctuary Chair Campaign Temporary Reserve Account.
- ◇ Approved a motion to approve Paula Davis and Susan Whitney to serve on the Nominating Committee.
- ◇ Approved a motion to support having a booth at the Gig Harbor Pride event in June 2026.



February Outreach: Migrant support at Riverton Park United Methodist Church

A big thank you to everyone who contributed household goods, clothing and funds in February to help the migrants who are housed at Riverton Park UMC in Tukwila. In addition to the items that were ordered and sent directly to the church, Ronnie and Phyllis delivered so many supplies with Ronnie's car there was not one sliver of cargo space left (see photo). Thrivent also contributed \$200 in grant funds to the project.



March Outreach Project: Phone Cards for AIDNW

Thank you for all your donations to AIDNW which will be used to supplement their budget for phone cards for clients at the ICE facility in Tacoma.

April Outreach Project: Food 4 All (Tortilla funds)

In April we will be collecting funds for Food for All, specifically, tortillas. Food Backpacks 4 Kids is now Food 4 All, a name change reflecting how the program has evolved over the years and is now a resource that goes way beyond providing supplemental weekend food for school children. Food 4 All, located on the Key Peninsula, houses a Family Pantry and Resource Center as well as fills Care Cupboards in schools and delivers supplemental food to about 50 households each week. Agnus Dei has long been a supporter of Food 4 All; we deliver about \$500 worth of tortillas each month to the Family Pantry. While we have funds for the immediate future, our designated income is not covering expenses. Offerings for Food 4 All collected in April would ensure solvency further into the future. You can also help by saving plastic grocery bags and egg cartons and bring them to the donation station in the narthex.

We will be serving dinner at Peace Lutheran on May 15th. Also in May we will be collecting diapers and in June we will be collecting food to help the Altrusa summer lunch program.

April 5, 2026: Easter Sunday: No Forum

April 12, 2026: Rethinking John 14:6

John 14:6, *I am the Way, the Truth and the Life. No one comes to the Father except by me*, has been traditionally interpreted to mean that there is no possible way to God or salvation other than belief in Jesus. Many Christians today continue to believe, or think that orthodox Christianity teaches, this exclusive path to salvation. That in turn has led to condemnation of those who are not Christian. When we hold onto this limited understanding of this verse, we miss out on a deeper meaning of Jesus' statement and his call to his followers. Please join **Kathy Gemar** as we explore this passage to find a more profound interpretation of what Jesus is saying and why John includes it in his gospel.

April 19, 2026: Gender, Sex, and Sexuality "Please bring your bible"

Please join us as **Dr. Antonios Finitis, PLU Professor of Hebrew Bible**, leads us in a basic introduction to what the Hebrew Bible says about sex, gender, and sexuality. The first three chapters of Genesis have been used for centuries to justify misogyny and the superiority of men over women. This is largely due to the work of scholars who have been predominantly men and have supported sexist interpretations. Once we take into account: a) a translator's bias; b) the socio-historical context; and c) the ways in which the narratives unfold; our inherited ideas on gender, sex, and sexuality for Genesis 1—3 quickly crumble to dust. Are we daring enough to embrace the complexity of the text and dismantle centuries of androcentric and patriarchal interpretations in order to promote a more accepting and diverse community?

Dr Finitis requests that attendees have access to a Bible at the forum. Agnus Dei will ensure that there are enough Bibles for everyone, but if you prefer, you are welcome to bring your own.

April 26, 2026: Sumud: Things that Make for Peace

Please join us as **Kathy Gemar** leads us in a glimpse of Palestinian Christianity using select devotionals from *What Makes For Peace* and *Breath and New Life*, the 2025 and 2026 Sumud Lenten Study Series. These devotions are produced by the ELCA using voices from the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land (ELCJHL) as well as leaders from the ELCA. We will learn about Sumud, an Arabic word meaning steadfastness, and the many ways in which it can help us envision a peaceful land and a peaceful world. This forum will include a short Lenten video from the ELCJHL, as well as a devotion written by Bishop Meggan Manlove of the Northwest Intermountain Synod of the ELCA, followed by talking circle discussions.
