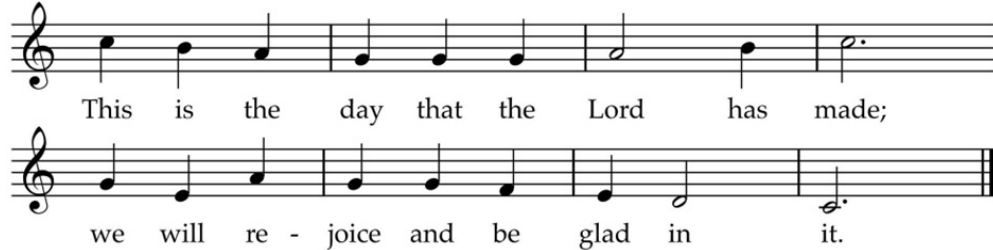

Presentation and Examination of the Candidates

Archbishop The candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Prnts/Spons. I present Nowak to receive the sacrament of baptism.

When all have been presented the Archbishop asks the parents/sponsors:

Archbishop Will you be responsible for seeing that this child
you present is nurtured in the faith and life
of the Christian community? *Answer* I will,
with God's help.

Archbishop Will you by your prayers and witness help this child
to grow into the full stature of Christ? *Answer* I will,
with God's help.

Then the Archbishop asks the parents/sponsors:

Archbishop Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of
wickedness that rebel against God? *Answer* I renounce them.

Archbishop Do you renounce the evil powers of this world
which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God? *Answer* I renounce them.

Archbishop Do you renounce all sinful desires that
draw you from the love of God? *Answer* I renounce them.

Archbishop Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Saviour? *Answer* I do.

Archbishop Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love? *Answer* I do.

Archbishop Do you promise to obey him as your Lord? *Answer* I do.

Archbishop The candidates for Confirmation and Reception will now be presented.

Presenters I present Ezra Eby for Confirmation and David Eby for Reception.

<i>Archbishop</i>	Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil?	<i>Answer</i>	I do.
<i>Archbishop</i>	Do you renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?	<i>Answer</i>	I do.
<i>Archbishop</i>	Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?	<i>Answer</i>	I do, and with God's grace I will follow him as my Saviour and Lord.

After the candidates have been presented, the Archbishop addresses the congregation:

Archbishop Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these people in their life in Christ? **We will.**

Prayers for the Candidates

Archbishop Let us now pray for Nowak who is to receive the sacrament of new birth and Ezra and David who are presented for Confirmation and Reception.

Deacon Deliver them, O Lord, from the way of sin and death. **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Deacon Open their hearts to your grace and truth. **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Deacon Fill them with your holy and life-giving Spirit. **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Deacon Teach them to love others in the power of the Spirit. **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Deacon Send them into the world in witness to your love. **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Deacon Bring them to the fullness of your peace and glory. **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Deacon Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and for ever. **Amen.**

The Celebration of Baptism

The Thanksgiving over the Water

The Archbishop blesses the water.

Archbishop The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

Archbishop Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

Archbishop We give you thanks, almighty God and Father, for by the gift of water you nourish and sustain all living things. **Blessed be God for ever.**

Archbishop We give you thanks that through the waters of the Red Sea, you led your people out of slavery to freedom in the promised land. **Blessed be God for ever.**

Archbishop We give you thanks for sending your Son Jesus. For us he was baptized by John in the river Jordan. For us he was anointed as Christ by your Holy Spirit. For us he suffered the baptism of his own death and resurrection, setting us free from the bondage of sin and death, and opening to us the joy and freedom of everlasting life. **Blessed be God for ever.**

Archbishop We give you thanks for your Holy Spirit who teaches us and leads us into all truth, filling us with its gifts so that we might proclaim the gospel to all nations and serve you as a royal priesthood. **Blessed be God for ever.**

Archbishop We give you thanks for you have called them to new life through the waters of baptism. Now sanctify this water, that your servants who are washed in it may be made one with Christ in his death and resurrection, to be cleansed and delivered from all sin. Anoint them with your Holy Spirit and bring them to new birth in the family of your Church, that they may become inheritors of your glorious kingdom. We give you praise and honour and worship through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and for ever. **Blessed are you, our strength and song, and our salvation.**

Archbishop Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

The Baptismal Covenant

Archbishop Do you believe in God the Father?

All **I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

Archbishop Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

All **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

Archbishop Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

All **I believe in God the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

Archbishop Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers? **I will, with God's help.**

Archbishop Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord? **I will, with God's help.**

Archbishop Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ? **I will, with God's help.**

Archbishop Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself? **I will, with God's help.**

Archbishop Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being? **I will, with God's help.**

Archbishop Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation, and respect, sustain and renew the life of the Earth? **I will, with God's help.**

The Baptism

The candidates is presented to the Archbishop.

Archbishop Nowak I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

All Amen.

Using chrism, the Archbishop makes the sign of the cross on the forehead, saying:

Archbishop I sign you with the cross, and mark you as Christ's own for ever.

The Archbishop prays over the newly baptized.

Archbishop Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised him to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.**

The Giving of the Light

The Archbishop then gives to the newly baptized a lighted candle, saying:

Archbishop Receive the light of Christ, to show that you have passed from darkness to light.

When the newly baptized has received a candle, the people say:

All Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

Archbishop Let us welcome the newly baptized.

All We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

Prayer for those to be Confirmed / Received

Archbishop Almighty God, we thank you that by the death and resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ you have overcome sin and brought us to yourself, and that by the sealing of your Holy Spirit you have bound us to your service.

Renew in these your servants the covenant you made with them at their baptism. Send them forth in the power of that Spirit to perform the service you set before them; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Candidates for Confirmation and Reception are presented to the Archbishop.

Confirmation

Archbishop Strengthen, O Lord, your servant Ezra with your Holy Spirit; empower Ezra for your service; and sustain him all the days of his life. **Amen.**

Reception

Archbishop David, we recognize you as a member of the one holy catholic and apostolic Church, and we receive you into the fellowship of this Communion. God, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, bless, preserve, and keep you. **Amen.**

When all have been presented the Archbishop shall say:

Archbishop Almighty and everliving God, let your loving hand ever be over these your servants; let your Holy Spirit ever be with them; and so lead them in the knowledge and obedience of your word, that they may serve you in this life, and dwell with you in the life to come; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**



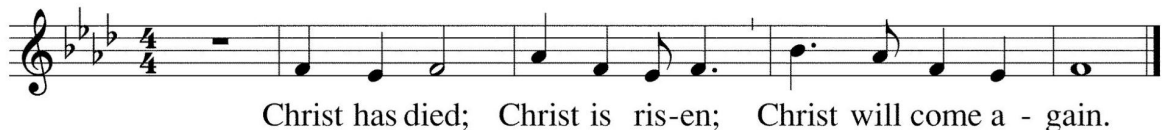

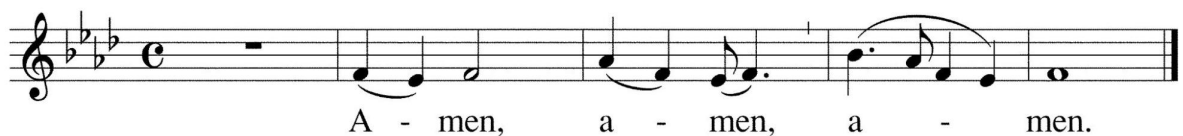
