Pastor's Message

Dear Saints, in my March 2026 article, I mentioned the book, *Canoeing the Mountains* (CtM) by Tod Bolsinger. I am about half way through the book, but I am noticing themes that remind me, no, strike me, as resurrection stories. That God makes a way when we see no way forward. That God brings Life, even when all we see is darkness.

Perhaps it is just good timing, or perhaps the Holy Spirit has once again aligned, but either way, we are celebrating the Resurrection of Christ Jesus, the first weekend in April.

In CtM, the author uses the Lewis and Clark expedition, as an analogy for the Church today. Once Lewis and Clark's expedition reached the mountains, they were suddenly in places that were literally, uncharted. What are we to do when we find ourselves, our church, and our mission/ministry suddenly not able to rely on old maps, charts, graphics, teachings, not to mention a changed culture?

One of the early themes is about what it means to be a church. "Lewis and Clark used their deep friendship, built on shared, meaningful, purposeful work, to build the Corps into a family... But it is crucial to remember again that the goals of the [Lewis & Clark] expedition was *not* to build a family—it was to find a route to the Pacific Ocean. Similarly, the goal of the Christian faith is not simply to become more loving community but to *be a community of people who participate in God's mission* to heal the world by reestablishing his loving reign "on earth as it is in heaven." (emphasis, Bolsginer pg. 70-71)

When I read this chapter I am reminded of the purpose, the mission of being a church community. Many community organizations can offer personal connection, a warm welcoming feeling, and opportunities for life-long friendships.

But the church is different, because, in addition to these attributes, we are called and focused on following Christ Jesus in his mission to reshape the world around us into a vision of God's love. We have a calling, a *job* to do, whether we are gathering for worship, fellowship, or service.

Jesus said, "I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing, but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. 16 You did not choose me, but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear

fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name." (John 15:15-16)

The mission of Christ Jesus was two-fold: to make redemption possible for every person through his life, death, and resurrection, and to start a movement of disciples who would share this message of redemption with all nations and generations. Followers of Jesus are called to continue this mission by making disciples and spreading the good news of salvation.

Blessings to you and yours, and may the love of God, and the Easter resurrection, guide your hearts and minds into greater love and service. In Jesus' name.

I am thrilled to share that First Lutheran is participating in an ELCA Faith Formation Co-Op with three other congregations from the Rocky Mountain Synod. The Formation Co-Op is an initiative of the ELCA Youth Ministry Network, in partnership with the ELCA, that partners with congregations to explore innovative youth ministry practices to root young people in a lifelong, transformative faith in Jesus Christ. As part of a four-year Lilly Grant, the Formation Co-Op has developed a listening process in which Guides accompany Congregation Teams as they discern and implement new youth ministry frameworks over 15 months. Thanks to Brad Hall, Sally Gaddis, and Sarah Scheiblich for being on this team with me. We attended our first of three trainings last month and will start hosting, "listening sessions" with various groups from our congregation and community. The listening process helps congregations gather and name

- 1) stories about their youth ministry to help them identify their "why" for youth ministry
- 2) current realities facing youth and congregations
- 3) congregational assets
- 4) existing and potential congregational partnerships

We look forward to learning how to consider new frameworks for our youth ministry that are suitable for First Lutheran. Please be open to sharing your stories and insights so that we can meet the needs of youth and families today.

Worship Committee

In the FELC First Light November and January newsletters we looked at our bulletin and how it provides the structure or framework that allows for a variety of worship styles. (The Gathering, The Word, The Meal and The Sending.) And I described what elements of our worship are included in The Gathering.

This time let's look at The Word. The second portion of our worship service.

*Prayer of the Day. The prayer of the day collects the assembly into one mind and heart. This prayer reflects themes from the day's reading or observances.

A musical offering which we at First Lutheran refer to as the Anthem follows the prayer of the day. (The musical offering may also be shared with us following the First Reading.)

The First Reading is from the part of the Christian Bible called the Old Testament. The OT contains history, law, prophets, and writings about God's covenant relationship with ancient Israel and us

The Second Reading or epistle is from the part of the Christian Bible called the New Testament. The NT describes Jesus's life and the early church.

Here at First a Children's Time follows the second reading. During Children's Time the first, second and Gospel readings are an intergenerational, and welcoming moment designed to make faith accessible to younger worshippers.

Next is the Gospel Acclamation. Here is when we stand and sing to acclaim the living Word, Jesus Christ, present to us in the gospel reading. The acclamation during general seasons is from John 6:68, During lent, the acclamation is found in Joel 2:13.

The Gospel. "Gospel" means "good news," and specifically the good news of God's salvation through Jesus's life, death, and resurrection. The First Four books of the New Testament are called "Gospels" for this reason.

The Sermon. Preaching brings God's word into our time and place.

There can be a Hymn of the Day following the sermon which is when God's word is further proclaimed by the congregation in a song that reflects themes from our readings.

The Prayers. The prayers of intercession are the time when we pray for the needs of our world, our communities, and ourselves. Our response of "Hear my prayer" is found in Psalm 143:1.

Following the prayers is the Sharing of Peace. We extend to one another the gift of Christ's peace, using a handshake, a hug, wave, peace sign or other gesture as each is comfortable.

Future articles will detail The Meal and The Sending.

The Worship Committee met in February. We discussed preparations for Lent and Holy Week. We will come together again for a brief time following Lent/Holy Week to discuss any immediate feedback and ideas for future services. We invite the congregation to reach out to any of the committee members for concerns, feedback and ideas.

The committee has purchased four Homebound Communion kits that contain a small flask for wine, grape-juice, the gluten free bread, and communion glasses. Please notify Maria Sutton or Pastor Garrett of life changes that prevent a member from worshipping in-person and they will add their names for communion to be brought to their place of residence.

The Worship Committee will meet again on Sunday May 3, 2026.

We can't wait to celebrate with you—come make wonderful memories together!



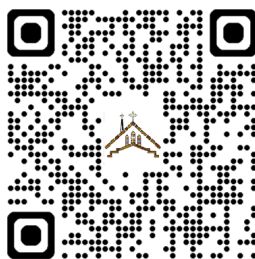

If you choose, you may cover that fee for the church at the same time you give which increases your contribution.
