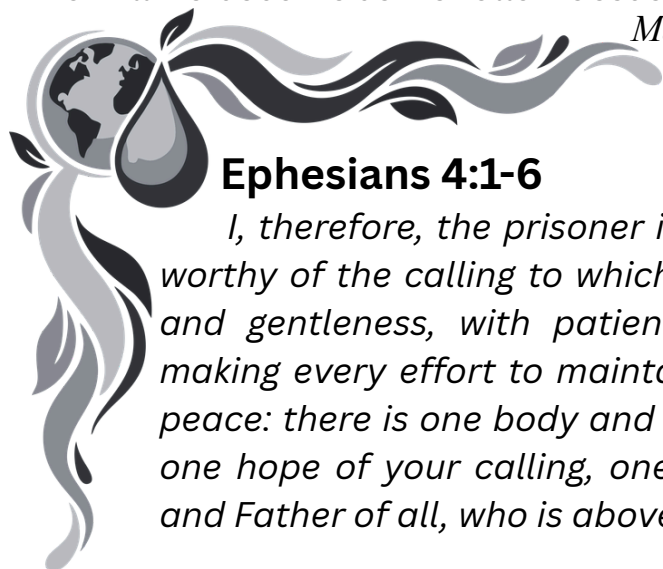

May the Peace of Christ be with you always...

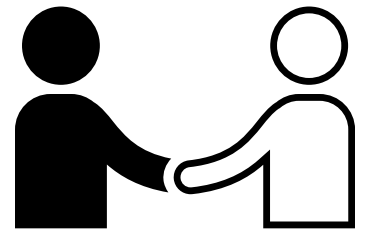

Question for you: When you see a name tag, do you ignore it, read it and forget, or do you call the person by their name? I use their name, and it often drives my girls crazy. The cashier at the grocery store, the hostess at a restaurant, the friendly smile in every aisle at Hy-Vee are only a few examples of where name tags can be seen. My girls are a little less extroverted than I am—not a bad thing, more generational I believe. It makes me feel good to make others feel seen. The smiles on their faces after I use their names are priceless. They genuinely appear to feel appreciated. Whether you are a little quiet or a little more outgoing, it is something to consider. The extra customer service is a bonus.

We learn Jesus knows each of our names and calls us by name in the Bible. A couple of examples are John 20:16. He calls Mary by name when He rose from the tomb. In Isaiah 43:1-2 it reads, "But now, O Jacob, listen to the Lord who creates you, O Israel, the One who formed you says, 'Do not be afraid, for I have ransomed you. I have called you by name; you are Mine.'" Ransomed meaning: He paid the price to set us free. These verses let us understand God knows who we are, and He claims us as His own. It feels pretty good, right?

I have a challenge for each of us. Each Sunday during Sharing of the Peace, find someone who you know, know of, or don't know at all. Ask their name, share yours, and grant them peace by saying, "Peace be with you (insert their name)." I guarantee the smiles exchanged in return will be gratifying for both of you.

Fredsville is a blessed community. Whether you have been here 60 years or 6 days, Fredsville is a place we should feel safe, loved, and seen. Maybe there is someone in our church community, the town, or the rural area we live in, or out in the Cedar Valley who doesn't feel seen. You can change this with a single word: their name. Let's have a fantastic 2026!!

Fredsville Lutheran Church Endowment Committee

The remainder will be distributed in the fall.

Meals on Wheels Community Service Summer 2026

Since Meals on Wheels lunches through DNH school end with the completion of the school year, Dike United Methodist, Fredsville Lutheran and Liberty Baptist will be collaborating to providing Meals on Wheels for clients during the summer. Meals will be available Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, June through August 28. Fredsville is responsible for Wednesdays.

The meals will be prepared and delivered by volunteers. Jean Loger will serve as the Fredsville coordinator, but this is a community project. We need your Help. Clients will receive enough food for one meal and no drinks will be provided. There will be 9-10 clients each day. Food will be in disposable containers that do not need to be returned. Meals will be delivered between 11:00 -11:30 a.m.

This is a community service - not a catering service. There is no fee for clients. If clients wish to donate the funds will go toward the Dike Food Pantry at the Methodist Church.

Thursday, April 2 - Maundy Thursday

Purple

This evening our Lenten observance comes to an end, and we gather with Christians around the world to celebrate the Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection. Tonight we remember Christ's last meal with his disciples, but the central focus is his commandment that we live out the promise embodied in this meal. As Jesus washed his disciples' feet, so we are called to give and receive love in humble service to one another. Formed into a new body in Christ through this holy meal, we are transformed by the mercy we have received and carry it into the world. Departing worship in solemn silence, we anticipate the coming days.

Prayer of the Day

Holy God, source of all love, on the night of his betrayal, Jesus gave us a new commandment, to love one another as he loves us. Write this commandment in our hearts, and give us the will to serve others as he was the servant of all, your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Friday, April 3 - Good Friday

No Color

Life and death stand side by side as we enter into Good Friday. In John's passion account, Jesus reveals the power and glory of God, even as he is put on trial and sentenced to death. Standing with the disciples at the foot of the cross, we pray for the whole world in the ancient bidding prayer, as Christ's death offers life to all. We gather in solemn devotion, but always with the promise that the tree around which we assemble is indeed a tree of life. We depart silently, and we anticipate the culmination of the Three Days in the Easter Vigil.

Prayer of the Day

Almighty God, look with loving mercy on your family, for whom our Lord Jesus Christ was willing to be betrayed, to be given over to the hands of sinners, and to suffer death on the cross; who now lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.

- **Matthew 26-27** - Jesus is betrayed, tried, crucified, and buried
- **Isaiah 53:3-9** - Jesus bears humanity's suffering, guilt, and death in our place
- **Hebrews 10:16-25** - God's forgiven people draw near with faith, hold fast with hope, and encourage one another in love

Sunday, April 5 - Resurrection of Our Lord: Easter Day

White or Gold

This is the day the Lord has made! Christ is risen, and through him all creation is made new! Indeed, “God shows no partiality” (Acts 10:34): Christ’s resurrection truly brings life to everyone. We sing hymns of praise, gather around sacred words, and proclaim God’s faithfulness, power, and love in the feast of holy communion. With the women at the tomb, we are astonished, elated, and grateful. We depart with joy to proclaim the good news of God’s endless love.

Prayer of the Day

O God, you gave your only Son to suffer death on the cross for our redemption, and by his glorious resurrection you delivered us from the power of death. Make us die every day to sin, that we may live with him forever in the joy of the resurrection, through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

- **Isaiah 25:6-9** - God transforms the wilderness into a safe, joyful path for the redeemed
- **Psalms 136:1-9, 23-26** - Give thanks for God’s steadfast love in creation, rescue, and faithful care
- **Romans 6:3-11** - United with Christ’s death and resurrection, we live free from sin’s power
- **Matthew 28:1-10** - The risen Jesus meets the women with joy and sends them to proclaim life

Sunday, April 12 - Second Sunday of Easter

White

In today’s gospel the risen Christ appears to the disciples and offers them the gift of peace. Even amid doubts and questions, we experience the resurrection in our Sunday gathering around word and meal, and in our everyday lives. Throughout the coming Sundays of Easter the first two readings will be from the Acts of the Apostles and the first letter of Peter. Even as the early Christians proclaimed the resurrection, we rejoice in the new birth and living hope we receive in baptism.

Prayer of the Day

Almighty and eternal God, the strength of those who believe and the hope of those who doubt, may we, who have not seen, have faith in you and receive the fullness of Christ’s blessing, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

- **Acts 2:14a, 22-32** - Christ’s resurrection: the fulfillment of God’s promise to David
- **Psalms 111** - I will give thanks to the Lord with my whole heart. (Ps. 111:1)
- **1 Peter 1:3-9** - New birth to a living hope through the resurrection

Sunday, April 19 - Third Sunday of Easter

White

Today's gospel begins with two disciples walking to Emmaus, overcome with sadness, loss, and disappointment. They had hoped Jesus, who was crucified, would be the one to redeem Israel! Yet the risen Christ walks with them and then opens their eyes in the breaking of the bread. Each Sunday our hearts burn within us as the scriptures are proclaimed and Christ appears to us as bread is broken and wine is poured. The story of Emmaus becomes the pattern of our worship each Lord's day.

Prayer of the Day

O God, your Son makes himself known to all his disciples in the breaking of bread. Open the eyes of our faith, that we may see him in his redeeming work, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Amen.

Sunday, April 26 - Fourth Sunday of Easter

White

Today is sometimes called "Good Shepherd Sunday." Jesus is called the "gate" of the sheep in today's gospel. The risen Christ opens the way to abundant life. He anoints our heads with oil and guides us beside the still waters of our baptism. Each Sunday he spreads a feast before us amid the world's violence and war. We go forth to be signs of the resurrection and extend God's tender care to all creation.

Prayer of the Day

O God our shepherd, you know your sheep by name and lead us to safety through the valleys of death. Guide us by your voice, that we may walk in certainty and security to the joyous feast prepared in your house, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Amen.
