### **Moving Forward in Faith: Living the Resurrection Life**

What does it really mean to live as Easter people?

It's easy to think of Easter as a single joyful day—filled with lilies, music, and the powerful proclamation that Christ is risen. But Easter is not just a moment; it's a season. And more than that, it's a way of life.

This year, throughout the Easter season, we will be exploring a worship series called "Moving Forward in Faith: Living the Resurrection." Each week, we'll follow the resurrection stories from Scripture and discover how the risen Jesus continually calls people—not to stay where they are—but to move forward.

On Easter morning, the women move from fear to joy as they run from the empty tomb to share the good news. A week later, Thomas moves through doubt into faith. Along the road to Emmaus, two disciples move from confusion to recognition as their eyes are opened to Christ walking with them. Again and again, we see that resurrection is not just something we believe—it's something that changes how we live.

And that's the invitation for us.

Resurrection faith means we don't stay stuck in fear, uncertainty, or the past. It means trusting the voice of the Good Shepherd, even when the path ahead isn't fully clear. It means relying on the presence of the Holy Spirit, who continues to guide, comfort, and nudge us forward. It means recognizing that we are sent people—called to live out hope in our homes, our workplaces, and our community.

As a congregation, we'll be asking a simple but powerful question each week: Where is God calling us to move forward in faith?

You are invited to be part of this journey. Come and worship. Come and listen. Come and be renewed by the promise that Christ is alive—and still at work among us.

Because Christ is risen...  
we are always being called to move forward.

# MESSAGE FROM CHURCH COUNCIL

---

April brings us into the season of Easter; a time of resurrection, of spring, and of new life emerging where we may not have expected it.

And it feels like we are living that out, together, here at Hope.

In recent weeks, we have welcomed new members from the Unity mission into our community, and we are witnessing the birth of a Chinese ministry among us. These are not small changes. They are signs of new life, signs that something is growing, even if we can't fully see what it will become yet.

As I have shared before, we don't have all the answers right now. We are in a season of discovery in which we are seeking to understand what God is calling this community to be in this moment and into the future.

And that kind of season asks something of all of us.

It asks for patience and grace, with one another, with our leaders, and with the process itself. This season also asks for openness to new ideas, new relationships, and new ways of being the church.

*And* it asks for involvement. For each of us to share our thoughts, our hopes, and even our uncertainties and fears while committing to communicate with compassion, grace, and respect.

This is not something being decided for us. It is something we are discerning together as a community in Christ.

At the same time, we are also taking steps to help support this next chapter. Council has made an offer to a new Manager of Parish Operations, and we are excited to welcome this person in April.

This is a new role for Hope, another sign of new life, and one that is intended to strengthen shared leadership within our church. Working in partnership with Pastor Greg, this role will help carry the operational and administrative leadership needed to support our ministry as it grows and evolves.

Over the coming months, this person will work closely with our current staff to help bring clarity, structure, and sustainability to how we function as a community, so that we are better equipped to respond to God's calling, wherever it leads.

This, too, is part of our resurrection story: making space for new ways of working, new partnerships, and new possibilities.

As we move through this Easter season, we are reminded that resurrection rarely looks neat or predictable. It often begins in uncertainty, in small signs, in quiet transformations that only become clear over time.

So, in this resurrection season, I thank you for your patience, I thank you for your openness, and I thank you for being part of this community as we discover, together, what new life God is bringing forth at Hope.

## HOPE FINANCE COMMITTEE UPDATE

February month-end financial reporting continues to show favourable results when comparing actual revenues and expenses to the forecasted budget and actual 2025 data. Offerings have increased for the first two months of 2026 by \$6,646.00 when compared to same time frame in 2025. Although it's still early in the year, this is certainly a very positive trend we are experiencing.

End-of-month numbers for March are currently unavailable.

The finance committee will be meeting in mid-April to assess the first quarter of 2026. I will report any findings or recommendations from that meeting in the May Anchor.

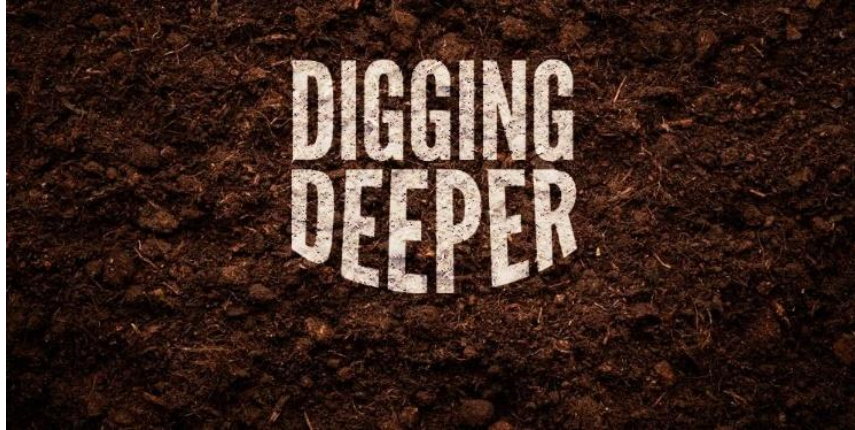

# FROM THE WIDER CHURCH

---



April 2026

Dear beloved in Christ,

Easter begins in darkness and cold, behind a seemingly immovable stone. Before anyone expects it, God is already at work long before dawn, while guards stand watch against the very possibility of renewal.

This is no polished or pretty day. A tomb is still a tomb. Even a small stone is very heavy. So let us not pretend that Easter is merely a “feel-good” moment. It is a day of grief, shock, and confusion. Women run with impossible, breathless news. Others hesitate, unable to receive it. All of this belongs to Easter. All of it is part of how God realigns the human heart.

Alleluia! Christ is risen!

We now live in an unfolding season of resurrection. We know that Good Friday did not have the final word. Life does. Freedom does. Love does.

And yet, we still feel the pull of forces that draw us back into oppression, rigidity, and captivity shaped by shame, exclusion, and isolation. There are voices that would wrap the cross in the banners of nation and power, shrinking the boundless love of Christ into something guarded and small. But the risen Christ refuses containment. Jesus crosses thresholds, breathes peace into fearful rooms, and gathers people from every language and land.

There are distortions as well. The Gospel reduced to moral advice. The cross softened into sentiment. The resurrection treated as metaphor rather than miracle. But Easter resists being tamed. It is not about improvement. It is about new creation. Not a gentle adjustment, but a holy upheaval in which even death is undone.

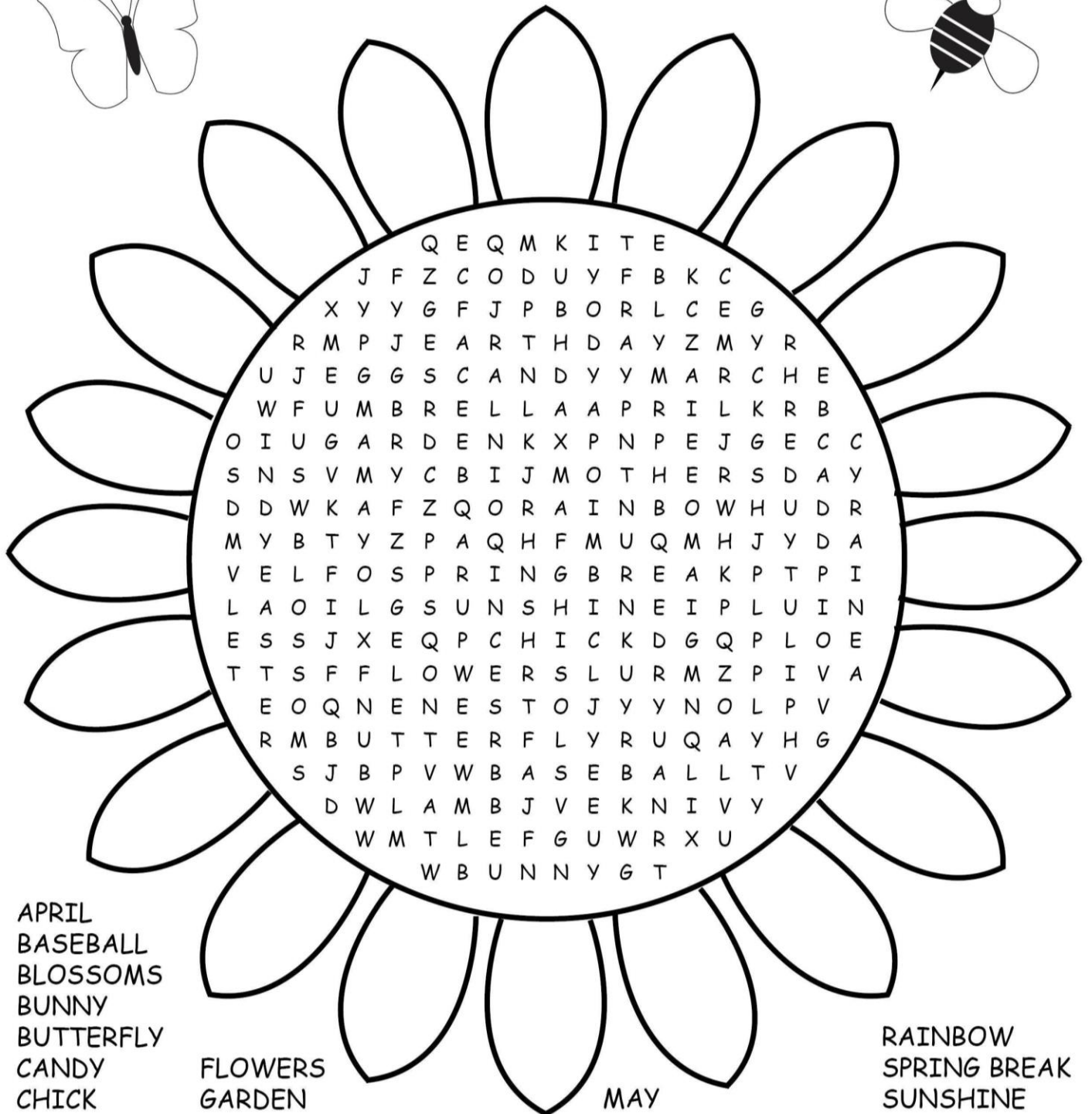
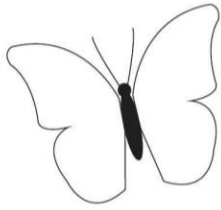
This is God’s wide-open invitation into a different way of being. The Gospel does not belong to any nation, political group, or even the Church itself. It is for all creation. It declares that life is not accidental, love is not optional, and hope is not naïve. The resurrection calls us awake.

Let us not become people who speak of faith without being shaped by it. This Easter, may we encounter the living Christ who still meets, teaches, and transforms.

Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

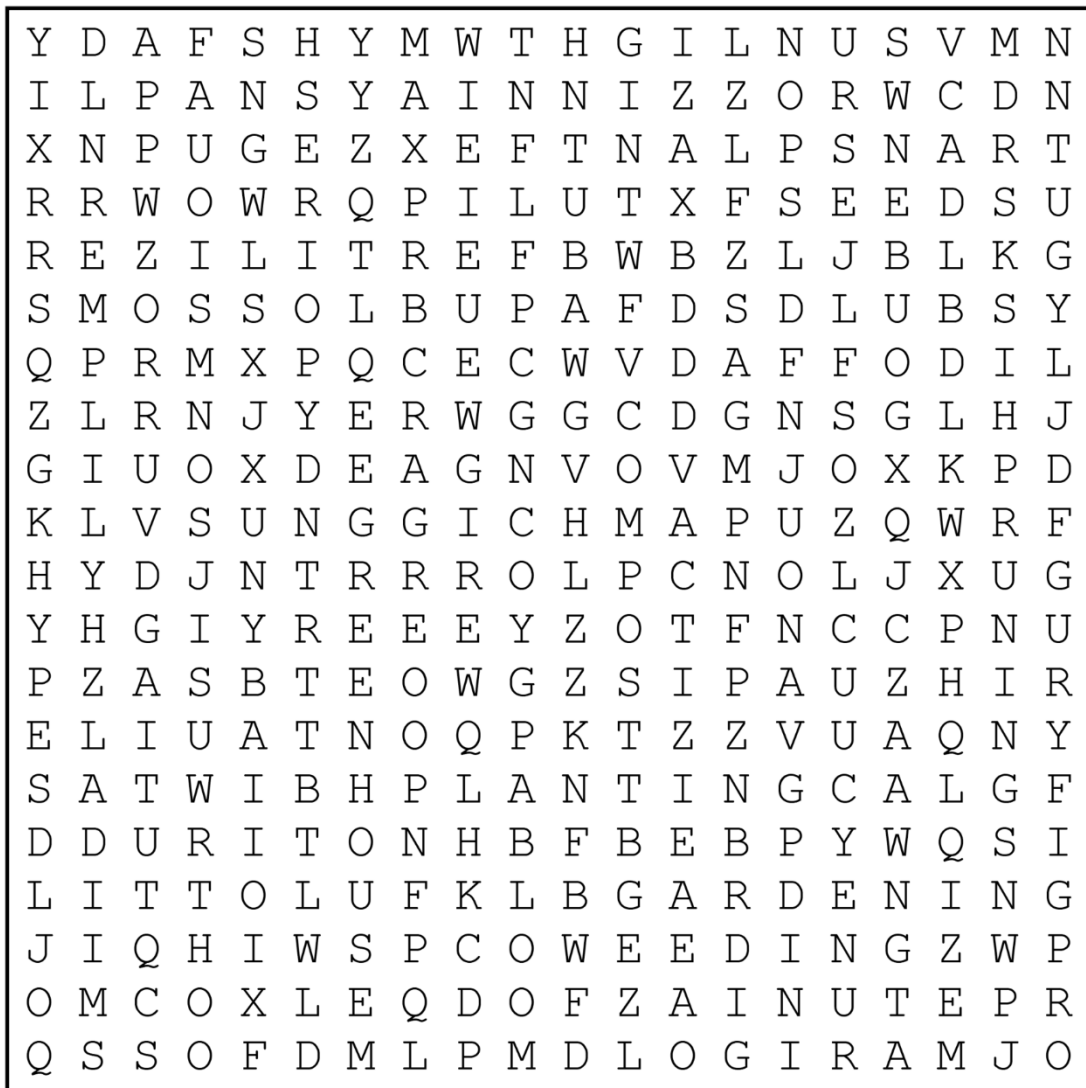

## HARBINGERS OF SPRING -by Kathy Lee

Ah, spring! New catalogue season! What joy there was when the Simpson's catalogue arrived in our rural mailbox, followed by the catalogue from the T. Eaton Company. That was the one we anticipated the most. The first page we always turned to was the one picturing the wedding dress that was being offered that year. One dress in particular was memorable because the daughter of our nearest neighbour ordered it for her wedding. It was lace with a three-tiered full skirt: pretty on the pages of the catalogue, but not so much in real life. It didn't flatter the bride at all and I dare say there was probably buyer's remorse. Alas, there was no chance to get something different because there wasn't another choice available from Eaton's mail order, nor was there time for a trip to Medicine Hat to shop for another one. Well, she looked really happy on her wedding day and the marriage endured, rock-solid, so the dress wasn't a factor in the end.

After checking out the wedding dress we went on to pore over the other dresses in both catalogues. "Ooh! That one looks nice! What colours does it come in? What's the price?" Okay. Ask Mom to get out the tape measure and check the charts in the middle pages to figure out what size to order. Fill out the form and mail it to Simpson's in Regina or Eaton's in Winnipeg.

Waiting for the order to arrive was hard. Sometimes it took more than two weeks but when a card came in the mailbox that a parcel was in the post office in Tilley, excitement knew no bounds. Mom wasted no time in hopping in the car to get it- C.O.D - Cash on Delivery. It was not uncommon for an order to bring disappointment because of a substitution - often a different colour due to the originally ordered one being out of stock. Sometimes the dress was completely different from what had been ordered and that was irksome indeed. If we'd wanted that particular dress, Mom would have ordered it in the first place. It was either accept the substitution or go to the trouble of sending it back, which meant another trip to town. Then the waiting game began again, this time for a refund. How tedious!

Ordering from the catalogue became more of a frustration rather than an advantage and so, over time, we came to depend more on the merchants in Brooks: Carol's Fashions and Hanen's for women's wear, Ingram's Store for children's clothing, Bev Nelson's for men's wear. (I think my dad probably still bought his overalls from the general store in Tilley.) Of course, when it wasn't ready-to-wear dresses, we were garbed in home-sewn garments when Mom had the time to make them.

We still liked perusing the pages of the catalogues, though, and continued to marvel at the Variety of things that were offered for sale, from clothing to shoes, to household items and yard goods, to toys, tools, and tires. (We dared not linger on the pages of corsets and brassieres, modelled by daring women. Who would be brave enough to be photographed in their undergarments, we wondered. Better move on quickly from that section!)

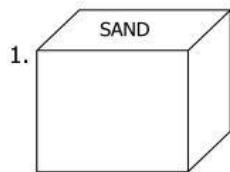
I can't help but think about how many trees were cut down to make the paper for those huge catalogues issued for years and years across Canada. It boggles the mind. 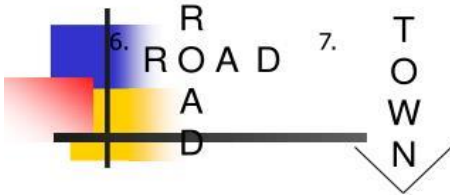

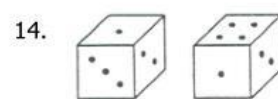

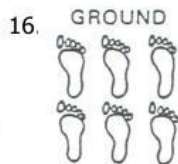
