I never anticipated that I would spend the New Year in the hospital with an asthma attack and some major stomach issues, but the Lord had something else in store. 2025 concluded with our church being involved in many ministries. The Lord blessed all of them. Our church had the opportunity to sing Christmas carols at Dora Nginza Hospital and deliver packets to the mothers. Each one of the moms received a packet with items for them and their baby including a copy of the Gospel in their language. This is always a very special time for our church family. Some of the church had the opportunity to do a Holiday club in the Piet Se Bos/Doran location where they were able to share the Gospel in Afrikaans with children as well as some adults. It is great to see the church people becoming involved in outreach in the community. The year concluded with the Christmas service at Vistarus Mission Station where the choir sang and the Gospel was preached. Thank you for your prayers over these ministries. We will be hosting another Holiday Club soon. This coming weekend will be a busy weekend as we have a Youth Rally with several other churches in our area and a 5th Sunday Rally. It will be an exciting time to be with fellow believers. I am so pleased that a couple of ladies are stepping up and learning to teach the children’s Sunday School class. In Sunday School, I have had the opportunity to teach several lessons leading up to the Crucifixion of Christ, teaching the children that Jesus is “the Way, the Truth, and the Life”. Pray for these children, that they may come to know Christ as their Savior and that they will take Christ back into their homes.



Xhosa Language Study

South Africa is home to nine official languages. For the first two years as a missionary, I worked on learning at least basic Afrikaans, for which I am thankful. Now, I have taken on the endeavor of trying to learn the isiXhosa language. But with English being widely spoken, it can be a challenge to get the needed language practice. Please pray with me that I have more practice opportunities and take every opportunity given to me to speak the language. Pray that I will be able to comprehend what I am learning and use it in everyday ministry.

Medical Ministry

I had the wonderful opportunity to conclude prenatal classes with the young lady I was working with and encourage her during her labour preparation. The day after we completed her course, her beautiful baby boy was born. Praise the Lord for her little miracle. She still faces many challenges as a young mom. Pray for her and for those of us who are working with her that we have wisdom in how to help with her education and helping with the needs of her baby. The Lord has strengthened my burden for the expectant mothers in Port Elizabeth, so I reached out to “Heart of Alternatives” a crisis pregnancy center here. I discovered that currently it is the only center available to over 1.3 million people and when I arrived they had 2 volunteers. It is their desire to see women make the right decision about their pregnancy and also receive the Gospel. My first day I had the opportunity to help a young lady who had just moved here from Zimbabwe who had been turned away from the clinic because she was too close to having her baby (She is due in April). She was very worried because her feet were swollen and she had high blood pressure previously. The Lord allowed me to check her blood pressure, which was thankfully normal and offer her some reassurance and encouragement. I am excited to see how the Lord will use me in this new ministry. The Lord has also given me the opportunity to mentor a Christian girl who recently graduated from high school who is trying to get into nursing. While she is waiting for admission into the nursing school, she will be coming alongside me and doing some of the medical ministries. She desires to use nursing as an outreach, possibly even go to the mission field herself one day.

I am booked for 6 more hours of driving classes at the end of April. I am praying that the next time that I take my driving test I will pass. Please pray with me that I will be able to get my driver’s license by May.
