The year of 2003 was a big one for me, as it was the year I graduated high school and began my college career at THE University of Toledo. My roommate, Eric, was from Dayton and was studying to be a film major. On a side note, he has been very successful in this career as a writer for numerous film projects over the years. Due to Eric's love of movies, he was often going to the movie theater and inviting folks to come with him. It was through Eric that I was introduced to what has become one of my favorite movies: Big Fish.

Big Fish is a movie about the "Big Tales" a father shares with his son. These truths (at times) seem so farfetched, so BIG that it can be hard to decide what is real and what is false. The movie speaks to the tension that these tales bring, between a father and his son. A long-standing relational rift is understood, however, due to the father's declining health the son begins to see his father (and his stories) in a new light. By spending time with his father, the son grew to see his father's heart and discover the truths in the Big Tales.

If you've not seen Big Fish, I encourage you to do so. The movie stars Edward Norton, Danny DeVito and others, so it should be easy to find.

I share this movie and its truths with you, having recently preached my sermon on the Older Brother / Son in the parable of the Prodigal Son. As I shared, the message came together out of what was supposed to be a nod and conclusion of the previous week's

message. The big take away from the Older Brother was this: You can be near the Father, but not know the heart of the Father. Stated another way, you can acknowledge God but not align your heart with his ways.

This idea of acknowledging God and not aligning yourself with his ways is a truth found in the book of Hosea. In Hosea 6:3, sinful Israel has found itself suffering at the hand of God. They decide the best way to bring an end to their pain is to acknowledge God. Acknowledge God and this hardship will pass!! Here's the thing, they acknowledge God but they do not repent of their sinful wickedness that has led to their hardships. They longed to be near the Father, but didn't know the heart of the Father.

Church, as we intentionally set our eyes upon sharing the good news of Jesus, the non-believing world largely views the message of Christ to be a "Big Tale". A bunch of stories that have been passed down over the years, full of unverifiable and farfetched events. These folks are like the son in the "Big Fish" movie. I won't spoil it, but the son gets the answers to his doubts. He does so how? By spending time with the father. Church, it's time we move beyond acknowledging God. It's time that we repent of the sins that grieve the Father. It's time that we press hard into the heart of God. Will you pray this simple prayer? God, I want to know you more.

Administration Board

Greetings from the Administration Board.

To recap highlights of the 2025 Annual Church meeting, last year marked Living the Word's 6th anniversary.

Our theme 2025 was "Reaching Further". A deeper call to be Christ's ambassadors both within and beyond our walls. We seek to create an atmosphere where we all can mature in our relationship with Christ and, in doing so, bring Christ to others. The year was focused on Discipleship and building up strong disciples for Christ.

In 2025, we kicked off our temporary part-time role with Ashlee Sheadler serving as the Director of Missions and Outreach. Ashlee has done an amazing job finding out how we can better serve our current and/or new mission areas, as well as how LTW can better serve the needs of our community and bring action to our witness. She contacted every mission LTW has supported historically. In doing so, she ensured that each mission aligned with the LTW core values and beliefs. This role will continue through much of 2026.

From a physical Church Growth standpoint, through October 2025, Sunday worship attendance averaged (225); (53) 1st service & (172) 2nd service. Children's Ministry check-ins averaged (30/week) on Sunday mornings and (15) at Wednesday Night Live. The Youth Ministry program averaged (12-15) on Sunday mornings and (20) at Wednesday Night Live.

From a Spiritual standpoint in 2025, LTW has been truly blessed. We received (15) new church memberships, (6) child dedications, (5) baptisms, and countless examples of personal growth in Christ. Much of this can be attributed to you, the LTW family. The warm acceptance that people find here. People visit here, looking for a church they can call their own and say they knew right away LTW felt like home.

It also goes without saying, LTW is blessed with an amazing staff of individuals who work endless hours to Pastor, Teach, Mentor, Support, Encourage, Comfort, and most importantly, Pray for you individually and our church.

Focusing on the LTW Mission Statement, Growing His Disciples, Equipping (t)His Church, Loving (t)His Community, in 2025, Pastor JD developed a Teaching Team. These folks are used to fill the pulpit on Sunday mornings as needed or when the Pastor is away. Pastor JD also conducted a Discipleship Training to learn how to build relationships, introduce the gospel and lead people to Christ. After the training, Pastor JD also conducted a follow up Discipleship class during the Sunday School hour.

From a facility standpoint, as mentioned in 2024, we were faced with new challenges in 2025. We found our biggest challenge was to be our HVAC systems. As mentioned, our newest system out of 8 existing systems was installed in 1998. In 2025, we replaced (2) units located in the multi-purpose area. We had (3) additional units that were in bad shape and could no longer get parts to repair. These were also replaced.

The Trustees were also looking to replace the carpet in 2025 and make alterations to the platform but had to move it for 2026 consideration due to addressing the HVAC needs and wanting to stay within their 2025 approved budget. I want to thank Scott Sutherland and the Trustee committee for their hard work and wise use of church funds as they manage our facilities, as well as all the physical assets of the church.

The theme for 2026 will be “Sending”, taking what we learned, putting it into action, and sharing it outside the walls of LTW.

New business approved during the meeting:

1. 2026 Annual Church Budget - \$509,183 (\$62k less than 2025)
 2. Revision to the church leadership structure. The current Elder Board was being consumed with church business and ministries. As noted in scripture, Elders are to be “spiritual overseers” of the church. The realignment of roles included the formation of a new Elder Board focused on the spiritual aspects while current Elder members were renamed to Deacons/Chairpersons.

God has blessed us with wonderful people and resources to do these gatherings.

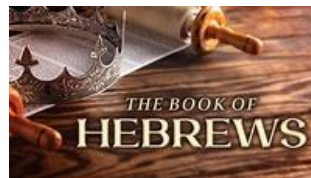
All seniors in the church are welcome to come to the dinners and share in the fellowship. The more the merrier!!

Hello Living the Word Church,

As we begin a new year together, I want to share a brief update on our church's financial picture for January and our early results for February.

January Summary

January giving totaled **\$21,081**. This was lower than expected, most likely due to the bitter cold weather and a cancelled Sunday service—both of which affected weekly offerings.

Expenses for January came to **\$29,721**, which is typical for the first quarter as we restart full ministry activities and utilities climb during the winter months.

February Giving (through two Sundays)

The good news is that February is off to a strong start. Through just the first two Sundays, giving has reached **\$29,645**, which places us **ahead of our weekly giving goal**. Your generosity and commitment are already making a positive impact as we move into 2026.

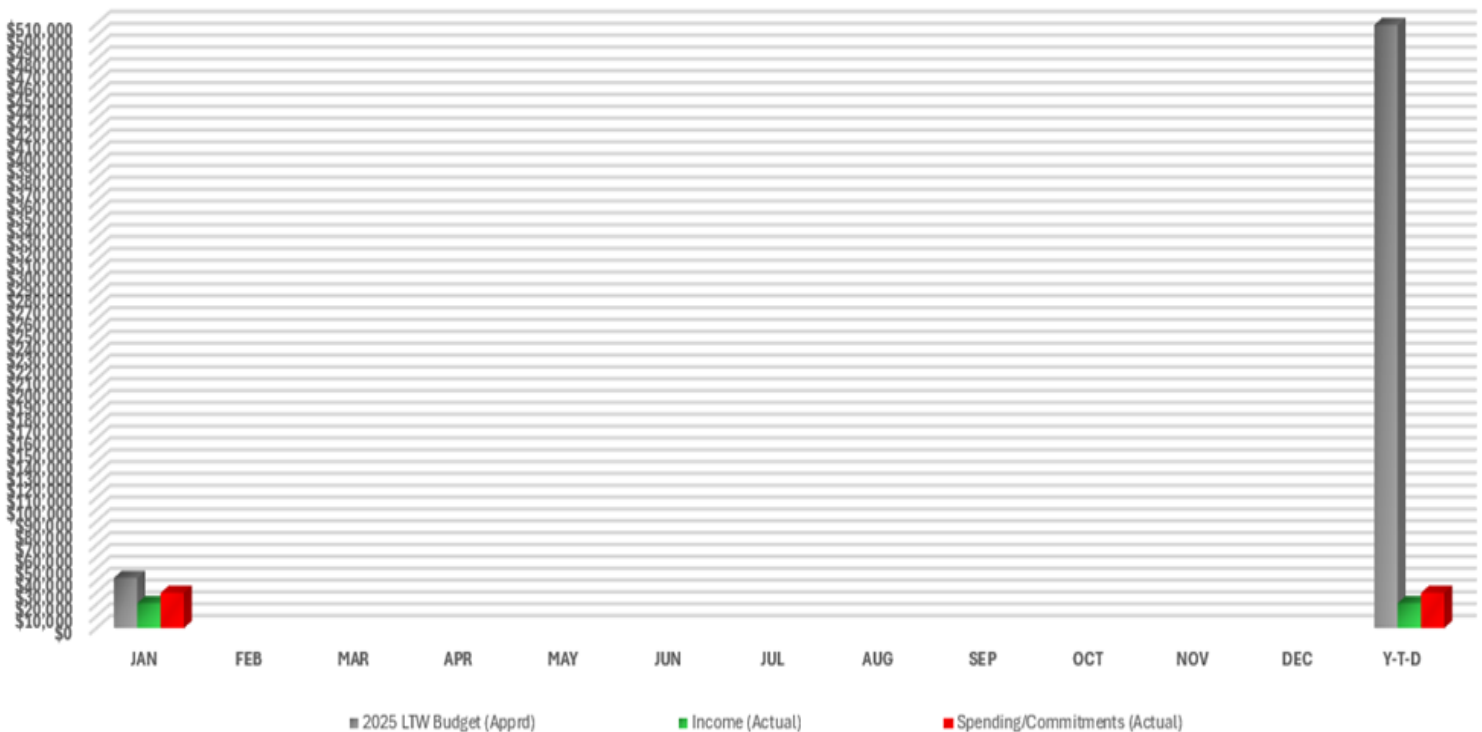

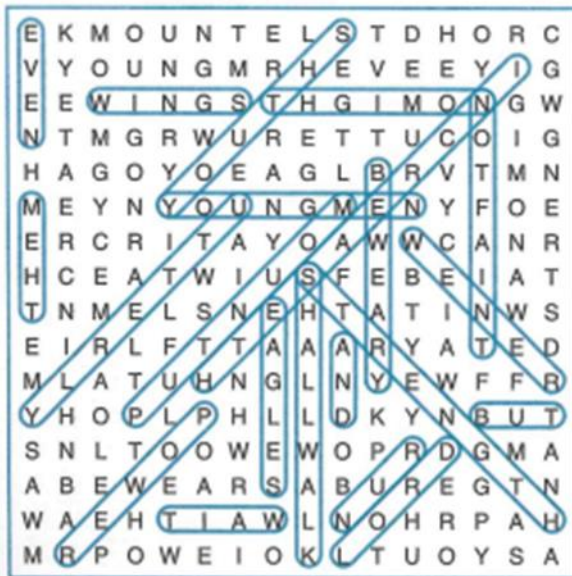

The problem with this is, you don't know when or in what condition you'll be in when you take that last breath, when you "kick the bucket." Are you confident you are going to join Christ in His kingdom? If not, why not? If you are not confident, then how can you become confident, even guaranteed?

- Do you believe that Jesus is the holy Son of God (John 3:16)? He's not just a prophet or good person, He is God's Son.
- Do you believe that Jesus is "the way, the truth, and the life, that no one can come to the Father except through Him" (John 14:6). If you think there is another way to heaven, you're going to be surprised.
- Do you believe you have sinned and sin separates us from God? "The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Rom 6:23).
- Have you confessed your sins? "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:8-9).
- Do you believe that Jesus paid the price to redeem you from your sins so that you are holy to enter in the presence of God? "But God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Rom 5:8).
- Do you "Believe in the Lord Jesus and you will be saved" (Acts 16:31).?
- How did you answer? There are no "maybes," "sometimes," or "I think so." If you answered "yes" to these questions then you are saved! Study and claim "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16). Don't let Satan raise doubt and confusion about your salvation.

You have just started. It takes work and conviction to finish a race. Now that you know you are saved, map a course to grow in wisdom and grace. Maybe start with daily devotions. Consider these devotions as fuel, you can't run on empty! Make reading the Bible and spending some time with God as essential as oxygen. Several have found the app "Through the Word" very helpful. You can start with any book of the Bible, though I would encourage you to start with the Gospels. Each day has a chapter and commentary. Studying in a group can also help you grow.

I can guarantee that giving your life to Christ is one decision you will never regret!
