



Sermon Based Questions

"Easter Sunday: Exhibit A" – Nathan Blais

April 5, 2026

Our Easter Sunday sermon focuses on the resurrection of Jesus as both a historical claim and a present reality that changes lives. Looking at Luke 24 and Acts 26, Pastor Nathan emphasized that the strongest evidence for the resurrection is a life transformed by the risen Christ.

Share

1. What is one Easter memory or tradition that has stuck with you over the years?
2. What is something that feels like a clear sign of spring, new life, or a fresh start?
3. What is one moment when someone else's story, excitement, or passion made something feel more real to you?

Discuss

4. Read Luke 24:1–8. Discuss what stands out to you about the women arriving at the tomb expecting death and instead hearing that Jesus had risen.
5. The sermon highlighted the angels' question, "Why do you seek the living among the dead?" What do you think that question meant for the women in that moment, and why is it still powerful now?
6. The sermon argued that a transformed life is one of the strongest evidences for the resurrection. Why do you think personal transformation is such compelling evidence?
7. Read Acts 26:14–18. What do Jesus' words to Saul reveal about conviction and grace?

Reflect

8. Where do you most relate to the idea of "looking for the living among the dead" in your own life—searching for hope, meaning, or satisfaction in places that cannot truly give it?
9. The sermon asked how often Jesus may be trying to get our attention while we keep resisting. Where might you be "kicking against the goads" right now?
10. Read Acts 26:16–18. Reflect on what it would look like for your own life to be "Exhibit A" of Jesus' transforming power to other people.

11. What is one practical way you can make space this week to listen for the voice of Jesus?
12. Who is one person in your life that may need to see the hope of the risen Christ through your actions, encouragement, or presence this week?
