Singing a "Different Tune" – Happy Eastertide!



John Nicholson Ireland (1879 – 1962) was one of the leading English composers of his generation. He received his musical training at the Royal College of Music in London (1893 - 1897), studying composition with the brilliant Irish composer and musician C.V. Stanford (*When In Our Music God is Glorified*).

As an organist/choirmaster, Ireland's compositions span fifty years and include all sorts of media, including the score to the film *The Overlanders* (1946-47). His church music includes eight hymn tunes, and one of the most beautiful settings for Samuel Crossman's sacred poem "My song is love unknown." In its original form, the poem includes seven, yes, *seven* verses. Here's an amazing part of this story...

Mr. Ireland composed his inviting tune "LOVE UNKNOWN" on the back of a menu a few minutes after he received the poem. Talk about inspiration! With "intimate and free-flowing treatment" wrote one commentator, the personal sense of the words come to life. (E. Routley in Hymnal Companion J. Fyock, writer & L. Wright, ed. (B. Press, 1996:233))

Here's the thing: Crossman's poem is often found set to a different tune called "RHOSYMEDRE" (by Anglican minister J. D. Edwards, 1836, named after his Welsh parish) as it appears in the United Church of Christ's *New Century Hymnal*. When we sang this hymn on Palm Sunday, I asked Susan and the choir to help lead the Ireland tune, rather than Edward's tune, because I first learned this most favorite hymn of mine, using Ireland's music. How surprised I was to find that our *Chalice Hymnal* doesn't include this hymn in any form!? (hymnary.org/tune/rhosymedre). My Anabaptist roots followed the English roots rather than the Anglican music for these words.

There are often a variety of tunes which can be paired with familiar lyrics and this allows for multiple ways to express the tone or sentiment of our liturgy. It sometimes provides us with ways to make discreet adjustments for inclusivity in the language of the lyrics as well.

History happens every time we share "psalms, hymns and spiritual songs" in our worship together. (Ephesians 5:19, Colossians 3:16). By interspersing tunes and lyrics from different parts of the world, we can celebrate the message of God's love and our faith with diversity and beauty. I hope you'll be a part of the most dramatic and important worship services this week during Holy Week and throughout Eastertide. There will be many opportunities to listen and to sing and to make melody in our hearts. Here are the words for the original verse six:

**IN LIFE, NO HOUSE, NO HOME
MY LORD ON EARTH MIGHT HAVE;
IN DEATH, NO FRIENDLY TOMB
BUT WHAT A STRANGER GAVE.
WHAT MAY I SAY? HEAV'N WAS HIS HOME;
BUT MINE THE TOMB WHEREIN HE LAY.**

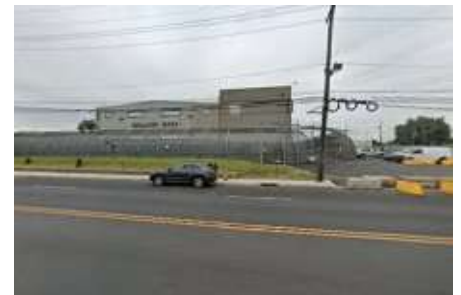

We don't care how good you think you may or may not be. Please consider joining our choir community. Our soprano section would love another member or two, but we have room in every section. If you don't sing but you play an instrument and would like to participate in some way, there are opportunities for you, too.

As our Stewardship campaign is coming to a close, and the last of the pledges are being turned in, I want to thank you for your financial commitments to the church. Your gifts support our music-making.

GREAT NEWS FROM SYLVIA'S CHILDREN

Next month will be 23 years since Sylvia's Children was formed. When I was adopted by the Mbirizi Advanced Primary and Day Care School to be their grandmother I took it seriously. I also saw it as an opportunity to prove that, given the tools, people could be independent and self-sustaining, not depending on others to support them. I have tirelessly worked on this concept and, as of Decembre 31, 2025, the goal was reached! 😊

In addition to all the capital improvements, that last being both a decent boys' lavatory and a decent girls' lavatory, I have given the school the tools to generate revenue through 10 business opportunities which include coffee bean sales, eggs (from our 20,000 chickens!), a sewing business, a 50 piece brass band for parades, etc., and a bus to rent out for school trips/weddings/etc.to name a few. With these businesses they can cover the costs of operating the school as well as secondary education and college for orphans.



Now, how about the Christmas party? There is even enough money for that too! And how does that impact Christmas in July? We have already identified another school ... 600+ students ...where we will be putting on a Christmas party this year. THEY HAVE NEVER HAD ONE! It is the Mustard Seed School in Lukaya and, miracle of miracle, it is run by another New Jersey woman! (As you know we do Christmas in July to raise money ... get ready!).

Now, I want to do a little teaser. We have another initiative that will expand upon the mission statement of Sylvia's Children and could ultimately impact 75% of the Ugandan population of women and children. (50% of the population in Uganda is 17 and UNDER!). Here is the mission statement ... see if you can guess the next project:

To provide quality health care and education to the underserved and underprivileged children and families of Uganda Africa through a comprehensive (rural hub and spoke model) healthcare program/facility and a proven self-sustaining educational model

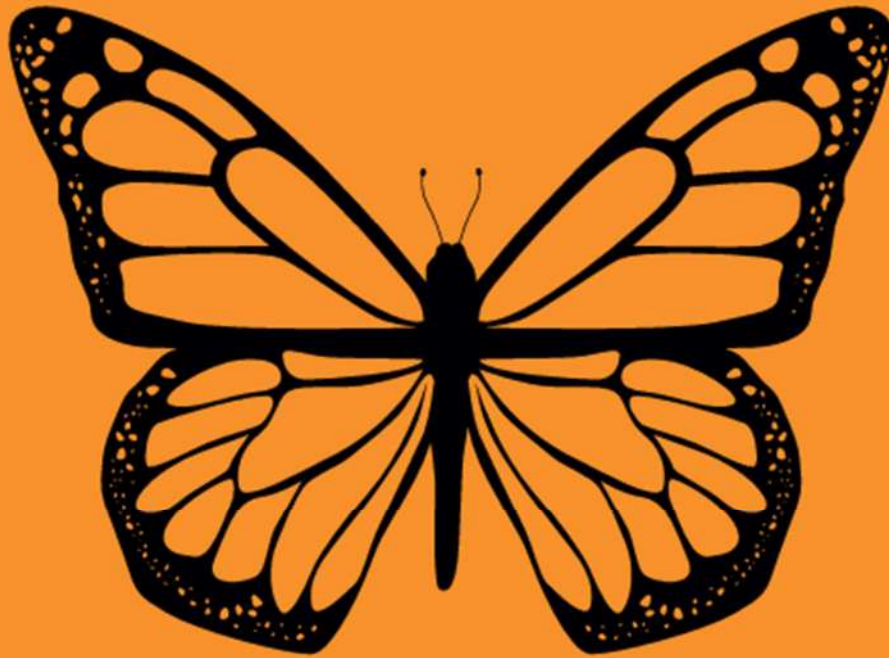

In 2024, our Community Kitchen served 132,497 meals, a 38% increase from 2023. **Our Your Choice Pantry saw a jarring 66% increase in food distributed** last year. The demand for food and assistance offered at Lunch Break is increasing rapidly, and we rely on our community to help fill the gap.
