

Growth Group Questions – 4/26/26

1. MIM – Identify the main idea for today’s sermon. Defend that statement with Hebrews 3:1-6.
2. What do you prioritize over Christ? Maybe this is easy to think of because there are sinful patterns in your life, however, it may even be good things in your life that consume more headspace in your life. Identify a few of those things. Take a minute to think individually before sharing as a group.
3. Colossians 3 is helpful with regard to the first point of the message: Consider Jesus. Read Colossians 3:1-2 together aloud. What are the two commands here? What is the content of each of these commands? What is to be sought after and settled upon? Now read Colossians 3:3-4. The reason why we are to be focused on Christ seems to be identified here. What is it? So then, it seems right that we seek Christ and set our minds on Him. What are practical ways to do this? The sermon discussed prayer, reading the Word, and involvement with the local church. Get specific with how you could engage with each of these things.
4. Point 2 of the sermon discussed Jesus being worthy as God. This seems in ways to be a continuation of the train of thought from chapter 1. Read Hebrews 1 together and engage with the thought of Jesus being God. Are there other places in the Scripture that emphasize this point? See Revelation 1:17-18. In light of this, consider also Romans 6:9 and Revelation 22:12-13. How does this text make clear that Jesus is also God?
5. Read Hebrews 3:5-6 once again. The text notes that we are God’s house if indeed we hold fast our confidence and our boasting in our hope. This seems to have a conditional sense to it- is that the case? This seems like it would have serious repercussions, can we lose our status as God’s house? What we must recognize is that this is grounded in our hope, which is Christ, and we thus will persevere by the power of the Spirit in Him. Yet, one of the means of our perseverance is the local body (See Hebrews 10:23-25). How can you better encourage one another as you see the Day drawing near? How could you push one another to look to Jesus, Who is our supremely faithful Hope? Commit to doing that with one another this week.
