



Life Group Study Questions Romans 1:16-17

1. Read Romans 1:16-17 together. As you think about this weekend's sermon, what stood out to you? What questions come to mind based on the passage? Was there anything unclear or confusing?
2. Paul says "I am not ashamed of the gospel" which implies the temptation to be ashamed was real. Where do you feel that temptation most in your own life right now?
3. What makes it hard to speak openly about your faith in those moments?
4. The gospel is described as "the power of God" - not just a message about power, but power itself. When have you personally experienced the gospel doing something in you that you couldn't have done on your own? What did that transformation look like?
5. Paul says salvation through the gospel is available "to everyone who believes". Is there anyone in your life you have written off as unlikely to respond to the gospel?
6. The righteousness we stand in before God is not our own - it is Christ's, given to us through faith. How does it change the way you approach God to know he sees you through the righteousness of Jesus rather than your own record? Does that feel like good news or is it hard for you to receive?
7. Read Habakkuk 2:2-4 together. This passage says the righteous shall live by faith - not just be saved by it, but build their whole life on it. What would it look like practically to live by faith this week?
