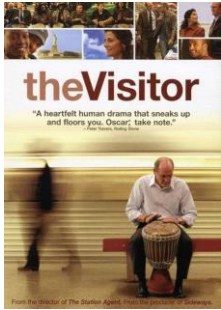


April Showers bring May Flowers MOVIES!

The Visitor (2007, PG-13) directed by Tom McCarthy

Richard Jenkins stars in this heart wrenching story about a widowed economics professor who travels to New York City for a conference and finds a young immigrant couple living in his apartment. Come and see how one man's life is changed irrevocably by this chance meeting, the relationships they forge, and the complexities of the immigration process they encounter. This film from the director of *The Station Agent* and the producers of *Sideways* is not to be missed!

Encanto (2021, PG) directed by Jared Bush & Byron Howard

This Disney hit tells the tale of a very ordinary member of an extraordinary family living in a magical house in the mountains of Colombia. As she struggles to understand her purpose as the only member of her family without magical powers, the mystical powers of the house—and family—are in danger of disappearing, young Mirabel decides that she just might be her family's only hope. This spectacular film features original songs by Lin Manuel Miranda of *Hamilton* fame.

Dick Johnson is Dead (2020, PG-13) directed by Kirsten Johnson

As filmmaker Kirsten Johnson and her retired psychologist father Dick face the onset of his dementia and the inevitability of his death, they work together to film over-the-top scenarios of his death, depict what his funeral might be like, and imagine his arrival at the pearly gates—all on film! This Critic's Choice award winning documentary tackles the challenges of mortality and grief head-on with humor and heart.

Hoosiers (1986, PG) directed by David Anspaugh

A coach with a checkered past and the town drunk come together to raise up a small-town high school basketball team to become a top contender for the state championship in 1950s Indiana. With star turns by Gene Hackman, Dennis Hopper, and Barbara Hershey, this classic underdog story of the power of team work, community, grit, and redemption has come to be considered one of the greatest sports movies of all time—come and see why!
