“Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength.”

How then are we to love, revere and worship God?

“IS GOD *BOSS*?”

Believe God

“But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him.” **(Hebrews 11:6)**

“IS GOD *BOSS*?”

Believe God

“He (*the devil*) was a murderer from the beginning, and does not stand in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaks a lie, he speaks from his own resources, for he is a liar and the father of it.” **(John 8:44)**

Believe God, Not the Deceiver.

Obey God

“But I strictly discipline my body and make it my slave, so that, after I have preached the gospel to others, I myself will not somehow be disqualified.” **(1 Corinthians 9:27)**

Obey God, Not Your Passions

Seek God

**“But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness,
and all these things shall be added to you.”**

(Matthew 6:33)

“IS GOD *BOSS*?”

Seek God

**“For thus says the Lord to the house of Israel:
‘Seek Me and live.’”
(Amos 5:4)**

Seek God, Not Sin.

“IS GOD *BOSS*?”

Serve God

“Also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying: ‘Whom shall I send, and who will go for Us?’ Then I said, ‘Here am I! Send me.’”

(Isaiah 6:8)

Serve God, Not Self.

“IS GOD *BOSS*?”

*Are you taking good care of your spiritual life ...
as a slave (bondservant) of Christ?*

“IS GOD BOSS?”

“And which of you, having a servant plowing or tending sheep, will say to him when he has come in from the field, ‘Come at once and sit down to eat’? But will he not rather say to him, ‘Prepare something for my supper, and gird yourself and serve me till I have eaten and drunk, and afterward you will eat and drink’? Does he thank that servant because he did the things that were commanded him? I think not. So likewise you, when you have done all those things which you are commanded, say, ‘We are unprofitable servants. We have done what was our duty to do.’” (Luke 17:7–10)
