## Miracle Sunday Offering is Sunday, May 17th

John Wesley made education a core commitment of his Methodist movement going back to its earliest days. In 1748, just a decade after his heart-warming spiritual awakening, Wesley established the still-thriving Kingswood School to provide high-quality education to the children of coal miners, as well as adults. So it makes sense that as the people called Methodist "spread scriptural holiness over the land," they planted not only churches but also schools for all ages. Those campuses eventually came to include United Methodist seminaries and theological schools to educate clergy around the globe.

But ensuring would-be pastors can pay for their education has long been a challenge — especially in Africa, the Philippines and parts of Europe. While 71% of United Methodist clergy in the U.S. have a master's degree or higher in theology, less than 5% of clergy in Africa, Europe and the Philippines can say the same.

That's where Miracle Sunday comes in. This one-time offering is scheduled to take place in the denomination's more than 30,000 congregations on May 17, the final Sunday of this year's Easter season. The offering will raise funds for the Endowment for Theological Education in Africa, Europe and the Philippines. The goal of the Miracle Sunday one-time offering on May 17 is to help permanently endow scholarships enabling 500 students each year to prepare for ordained ministry in Africa, Europe and the Philippines.

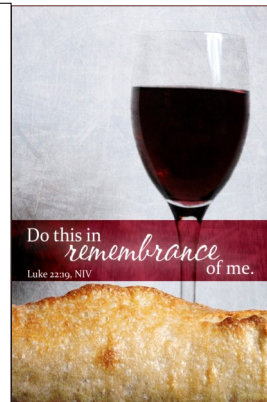

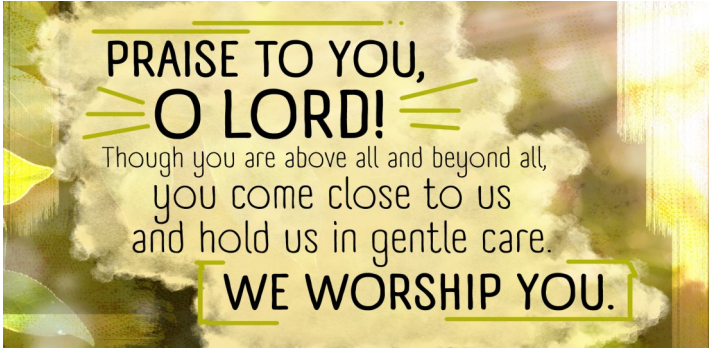

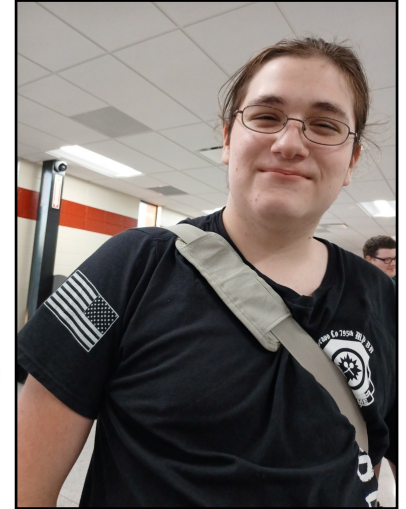

New Life's Community Meal Ministry provides a free, hot, ready to eat dinner for families and individuals who need it. No registration or sign up is required; just show up when the doors are open. In February 2023, New Life began serving meals at lunch time. This year the Meal Ministry is offering meals to go in addition to dine in. On average, over 350 meals are served a week.

The Meal Ministry was designed to ease people's daily burdens, and we've seen that happen. The cooking, serving and cleaning are carried out by a wide network of volunteers, churches, and organizations who serve one another by meeting a practical need and sharing lunch and supper.

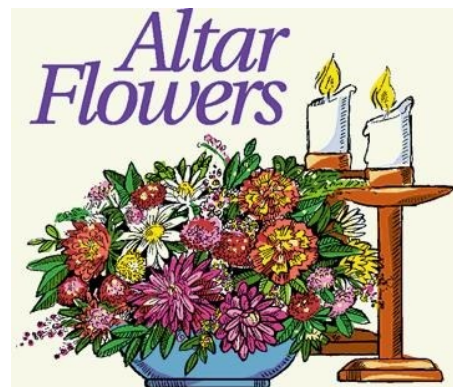

## Trinity United Methodist Church Endowment Fund

In 1994, Trinity United Methodist Church of Huntington established its Endowment Fund as a lasting way to receive and steward significant gifts for the future of our church. These gifts may be directed toward specific, designated purposes or given more broadly as undesignated funds to support the mission and ministry of Trinity. Endowment gifts are intended to strengthen the church beyond its day-to-day operations. As such, they are not used for routine expenses such as salaries, insurance, or utilities. Instead, they provide meaningful support for ministry, outreach, and long-term needs.

Gifts to the Endowment Fund are typically received in the form of cash, stocks, bonds, CDs, or mutual funds. It is important to note that all endowment funds come from individual gifts and are not supported by Sunday offerings or annual giving.

Endowment gifts fall into two categories: **designated** and **undesignated**.

Designated gifts are given for a specific purpose. Trinity is blessed to have three such funds:

- The **Hafner Fund**, supporting youth ministries
  - The **Kiracofe Fund**, providing camp scholarships
- The **Will/Hartle Fund**, dedicated to the Retreat Center

1 Together, these designated funds total more than \$150,000.

2 Undesignated gifts, on the other hand, allow the Endowment Committee to prayerfully discern how best to allocate resources each year. Following its first meeting, typically held in January, the committee determines funding available for grant requests across five categories:

1. Buildings and Grounds (Trustees)
2. Educational Programs
3. Missions
4. Music Ministry
5. General Ministry Needs

Currently, Trinity's undesignated endowment funds exceed one million dollars—a remarkable testament to the faithfulness and generosity of our congregation.

Not every church is blessed with an endowment fund. Trinity's was established over 30 years ago by forward-thinking members who believed in investing in the church's future. Because of their vision, the Endowment Committee approved nearly \$50,000 in grants in 2025. These funds supported projects such as a new roof for the Retreat Center, Trinity Pre-School scholarships, missions including Cru Kiev and Light for Life in Ukraine, new church signage, and equipment for the Recovery Group podcast, among many others.

Trinity's endowment funds are professionally managed through three trusted organizations: Osaic Wealth Inc. (Arizona), the Heartland Methodist Foundation (Indianapolis), and the Huntington County Community Foundation.
