I celebrated my 35yr workiversary this week with pie!
Is it the pie, or what the pie celebrates?

You get married and get a ring.
Do you love the ring, or what the ring represents?

“Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and vermin destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven...” **Matthew 6:19-20a**

It thematically asks the question:
Do you value the eternal more than the temporal?

“Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?” **Matthew 6:25-27**

So is the sermon on the mount about transcending this lower plane of existence. Not at all. It’s that if you value the eternal, it’ll shape the temporal. Worrying is the illusion of control, and not recognizing who’s really in charge.

“Do not judge, or you too will be judged. For in the same way you judge others, you will be judged, and with the measure you use, it will be measured to you.” **Matthew 7:1-2**

This verse in an attempt to silence their critics, Don’t Judge me! Interpreting Jesus’ meaning as “You don’t have the right to tell me I’m wrong” - That’s not what’s being said. There must be a distinction between judgement and still the acknowledgement of what is sin.

As a general rule, we don’t see Jesus pointing out everyone’s sin.

“For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him.” **John 3:17**

1 Corinthians 5 is like an episode of Jerry Springer that ends with Paul telling the Corinthians to expel the immoral brother. 2 Corinthians 2 says we love that guy, forgive him so Satan doesn’t get him.

“So in everything, do to others what you would have them do to you, for this sums up the Law and the Prophets.” **Matthew 7:12**

Everything I’m telling you... Jesus says it’s not easy. Take the small gate and the narrow road. (Matthew 7:14)
