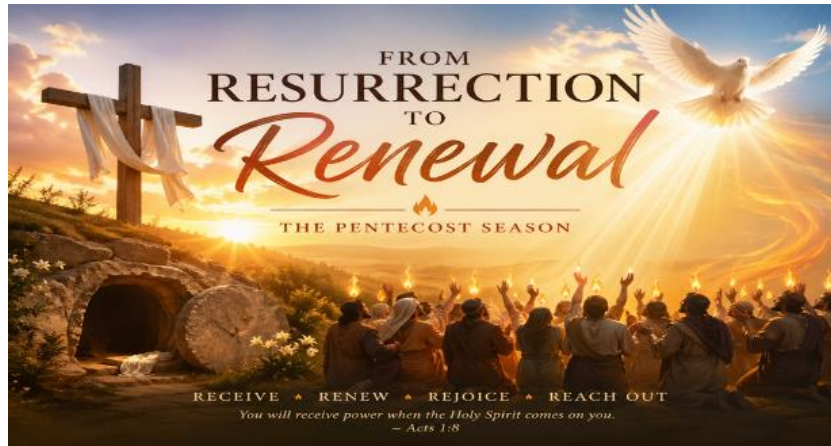

HOPE FINANCE COMMITTEE UPDATE

First quarter results for offerings and total revenue stream are favourable to both forecasted budget and 2025 actual figures. Total revenues are favourable to budget by \$5,941. Expenses are also favourable to both budget and last year's actual expenditures. This can be explained mainly in cost savings in wages and benefits with Mary S. being on Long Term Disability for much of the first quarter and Pastor Greg now working at 80% salary level.

Moving forward we will see increases coming to our expense stream as we do have another section of the roof to be repaired. Also, the hiring of Deborah Leung as Manager of Parish Operations will

increase our wage and benefits stream. These additional expenses were presented in the 2026 budget and approved at the Annual General Meeting in February. The finance committee will meet again in early June to review our financial position as we head into summer.

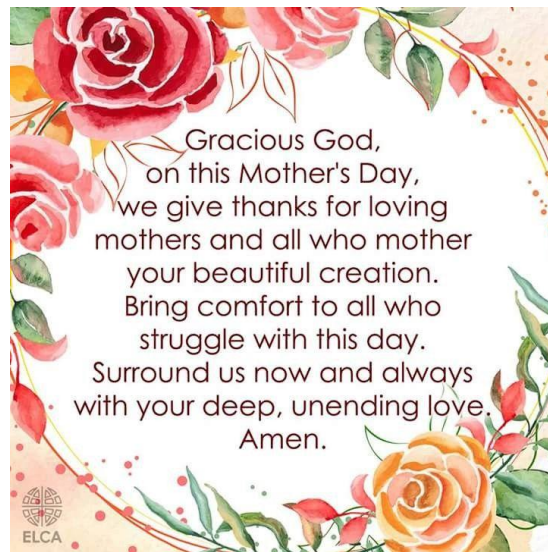

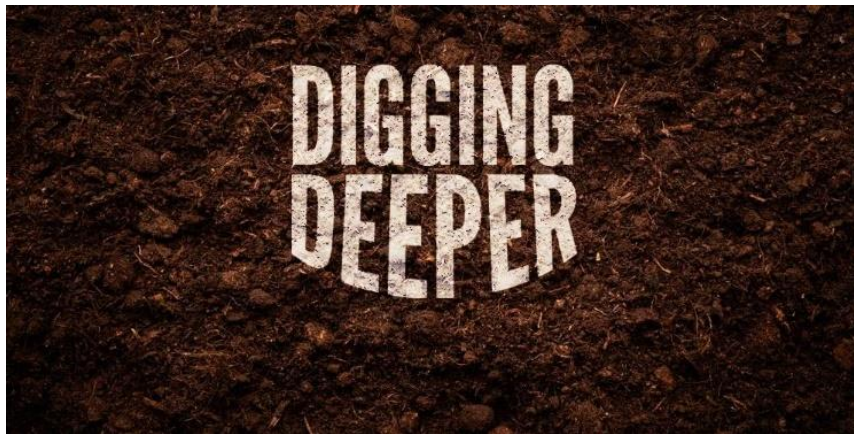

Reflections of a Prairie Boy by Jim Lee (as told to Kathy)

I was born in Elswick, Saskatchewan, a small railroad siding near the village of Midale. Midale, exactly halfway between Weyburn and Estevan, was home for my growing-up years. I was the youngest of three brothers. Winters were filled with hockey, summers with baseball, and although sports, particularly hockey, was my main interest, I was also a bit of a naturalist.

Once, I discovered a turtle in our garden. Western Painted Turtles were common in southeastern Saskatchewan. I'm not sure how it got there; we didn't have a slough or a pond on our property. It was very colourful and I decided it was going to be my pet. I really didn't know anything about how to care for it but I put the turtle in a window well so it couldn't escape. When I went back later to check on it, it was gone! How on earth? It couldn't have climbed out of the window well. My dad must have rescued it and set it free.

(Nowadays, it's illegal to keep any wild turtle for a pet.)

Turtles continued to fascinate me, so I got four small turtles. They were about the size of 50-cent piece. I can't remember where, but probably from a store in Estevan. Wouldn't they love to have some mud to live in? So I filled a wheelbarrow with dirt and watered it down into a mud soup. In went the turtles. They didn't stay on top, but they dove right down out of sight. Oh, no. I had to find them! So, up to my elbows, I squeezed the mud through my fingers until I found all of them at the bottom. No more mud! They went back to live in the box they'd come in. I don't remember how long they survived but it was quite some time.

We had goldfish for a while, too. (Didn't everybody?) I also rescued a young owl from a tree in the schoolyard next to our house. It seemed to be caught in the branches. I put it in the chicken barn and fed it hamburger for about two weeks. It regained its strength and then I let it go back to being a wild creature of nature.

After I graduated from high school I went to Saskatoon to attend the University of Saskatchewan in the faculty of Chemical Engineering. My turtle days were behind me but I still loved hockey and I became a member of Luther Theological Seminary's team, playing as a forward all the years I was a student at U of S.
