## PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Saints,

“People don’t buy what you do; they buy why you do it.” – Simon Sinek

As your Congregation Council looks ahead, we are preparing to share more fully about the financial realities facing our ministry together. When reviewing the monthly reports, you may notice that we began 2026 on a strong and encouraging path. Yet, as we look at the full year—and project based on patterns from 2025—we anticipate that, without change, our cash reserves could be depleted by October.

And yet, this is not simply a moment of concern—it is also a moment of invitation. Again and again, the Holy Spirit meets the church not only in stability, but in challenge, opening new possibilities for renewal, clarity, and faithful action.

First, an assuring word about financial stewardship. All individual giving is held in strict confidence; only our accountant and I have access to specific records. However, in observing overall patterns, a few broader insights emerge.

Secondly, giving, at times, has been influenced by personal preferences or concerns—about programs, leadership, or direction. This is understandable in a human community. And yet, as people shaped by the Gospel, we are called to something deeper.

In the Lutheran tradition, grounded in the witness of St. Paul, we confess that we are justified by grace through faith—a gift freely given in Jesus Christ, apart from our works (Ephesians 2:8–9). Our stewardship, then, is not a transaction or a response to satisfaction. It is, first, a response of trust and gratitude for what God has already done for us in Christ. We give not because everything is perfect, but because God’s grace is.

At the same time, we who have served in leadership—including myself—must also speak honestly. We have not always done a clear or compelling job of sharing why this ministry matters—why First Lutheran is a community worthy of your prayer, your presence, your gifts, your service, and your witness.

Simon Sinek’s well-known insight in *Start with Why* reminds us that people are inspired not simply by what (or how) an organization does, but by the purpose that animates it. The church’s “why,” however, is not a marketing strategy—it is the Gospel itself.

Our “why” is this:

We are here because of God’s abundant mercy.

We are gathered because Christ has claimed us in love.

We are sent because the world still needs the good news of forgiveness, hope, and new life.

In other words, we live and give because God has first given to us.

This is a moment to renew not only our financial commitments, but our shared sense of purpose. What might it look like for us, together, to trust more deeply in God’s grace? To give more freely, not out of obligation, but out of joy? To speak more clearly about the hope, we have in Christ?

I pray that the mission of this congregation will not be determined only by budgets or balance sheets—but by faith active in love (Galatians 5:6).

### **Important for you to know:**

Your Council began serious discussions about our unsustainable budget. As a congregation we are facing a budgeted \$130,000 short fall this year. This is a direct result of declining membership and declining giving; both issues we are addressing head on.

To solve the budget issue, we have only two choices: increase giving or decrease expenses, both of which we will share with you in the coming months. To solve the membership issue, we have formed a long overdue Long Range Planning Committee and asked for their recommendations. We will share with you their work in the coming months. Please keep your Council and our congregation in your prayers as we begin this discernment process.

## DEACON KORRA REFLECTIONS

Last month I shared that part of our Faith Formation Committee would be hosting listening sessions with various groups in our congregation. ## FIRST LUTHERAN WOMEN

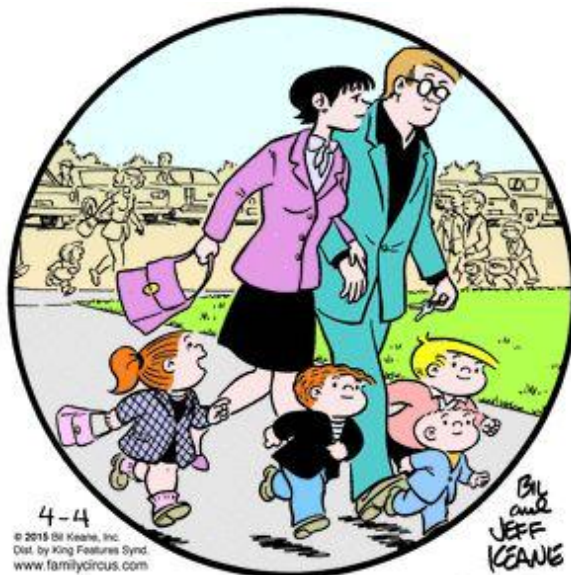

## WORSHIP COMMITTEE

This is the final installment of an explanation of how our bulletin provides the structure or framework that allows for a variety of worship styles for us. (The Gathering, the Word, The Meal and The Sending) The final portions of our worship service are The Meal and The Sending.



**The Meal:** God feeds us with the presence of Jesus Christ.

**The Offering:** is the first part of the Meal. The peace of God reaches out from our assembly into the world. A collection is taken for the needs of others. We give in grateful response to God's gifts to us. Offering is referenced in the book of Matthew (Matthew 5:23-24), John (John 14:27 and John 15:5), and also in Psalms (Psalm 51: 10-12 Create in me a clean heart, O God.)

**Holy Communion:** Before the Lord's supper is shared, the presiding minister leads us into thanksgiving. The Thanksgiving is found in Isaiah (Isaiah 6:3) and in the Gospel Matthew (Matthew 21: 9) The Words of Institution that are so familiar to us all are found in 1 Corinthians 11:23-26.

At the table, we praise God for creation and salvation, we hear Christ's words of command and promise ("do this") and we pray for the Holy Spirit to be among us in this meal. We conclude with the words of prayer Jesus taught us. The Lord's Prayer. (Pray then in this way: Our Father in heaven. Matthew 6: 9-13) In Christ's body and blood given to us, God's saving mission is made known.

We sing as the bread is broken and as the meal is shared. We receive the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world (John 1:29) We are forgiven and given new life.

**The Sending.** God blesses us and sends us in mission to the world.

**The Benediction:** The presiding minister blesses us in the name of God, granting us God's favor and peace. (Numbers 6:23-26 You shall say to them, the Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face to shine upon you, and be gracious to you; the Lord lift up his countenance upon you, and give you peace.)

**There is a Sending Hymn. And the Sending (dismissal):** We are sent out to continue our

participation in God's mission. We go from here to live as Christ's body in the world.

"Go in peace. Keep awake" **Thanks be to God.**

**Giving Online** is available on our website! Giving online allows you to make one-time or recurring offering contributions with a Credit or Debit Card or ACH bank transfer through Breeze ChMS (our church management system) who partners with Stripe for secure financial services. As with any electronic transaction, our church pays a small transaction fee to process the online payments. If you choose, you may cover that fee for the church at the same time you give which increases your contribution.

**Thrivent Choice Dollars** – Eligible clients with Thrivent membership can recommend where Thrivent distributes some of its charitable grant funds. These recommendations are shared by directing Choice Dollars to enrolled nonprofit organizations, including churches.

**Thrivent Action Grants** – Thrivent Action Grants are financial awards designed to empower individuals and groups to initiate small-scale projects that benefit their communities.
