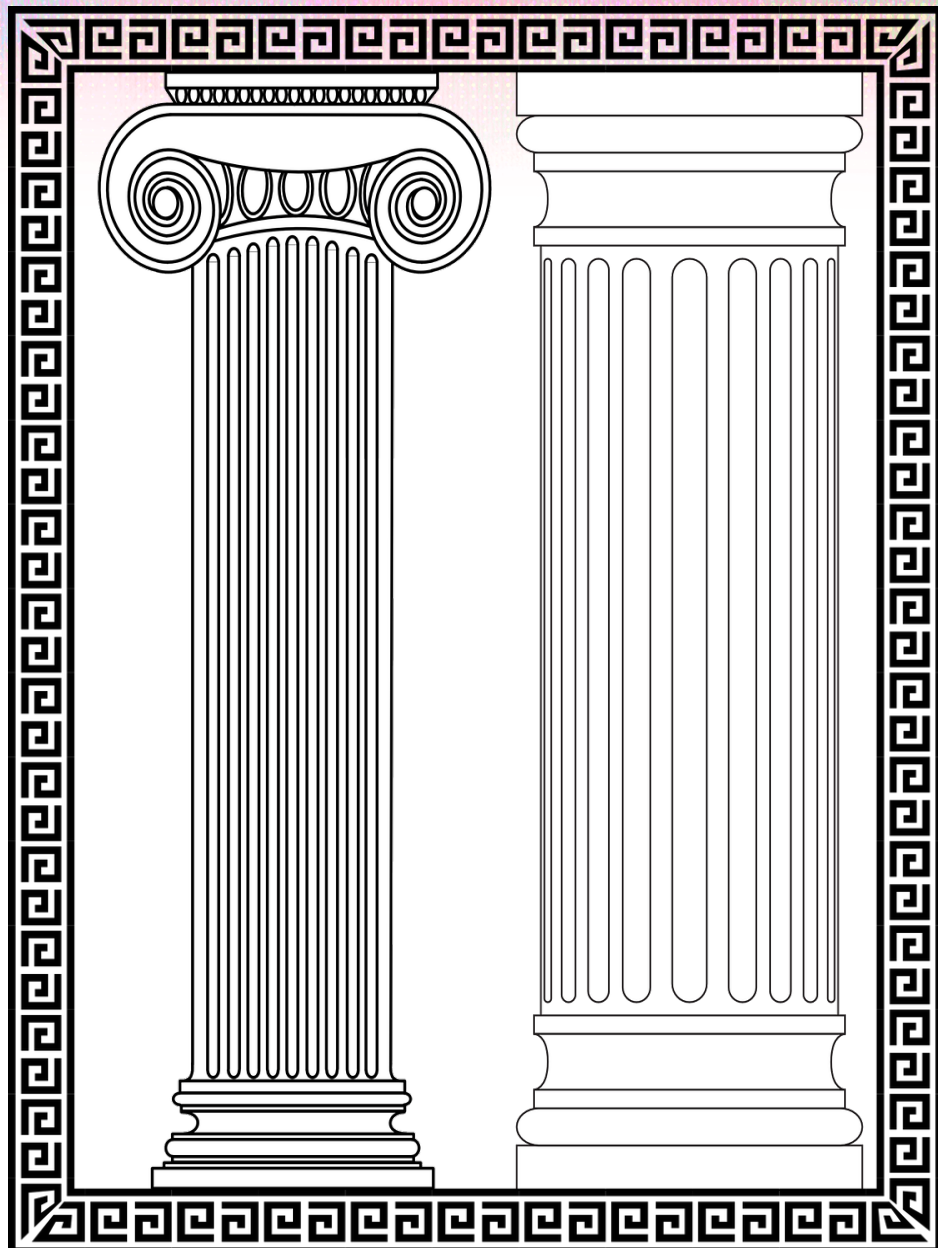


Draw & Color

Paul taught the people about Jesus and some of them believed. Paul just loved to share the good news wherever he went!



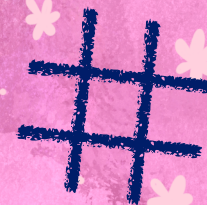
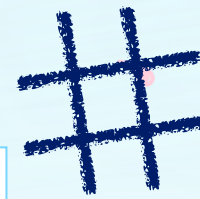
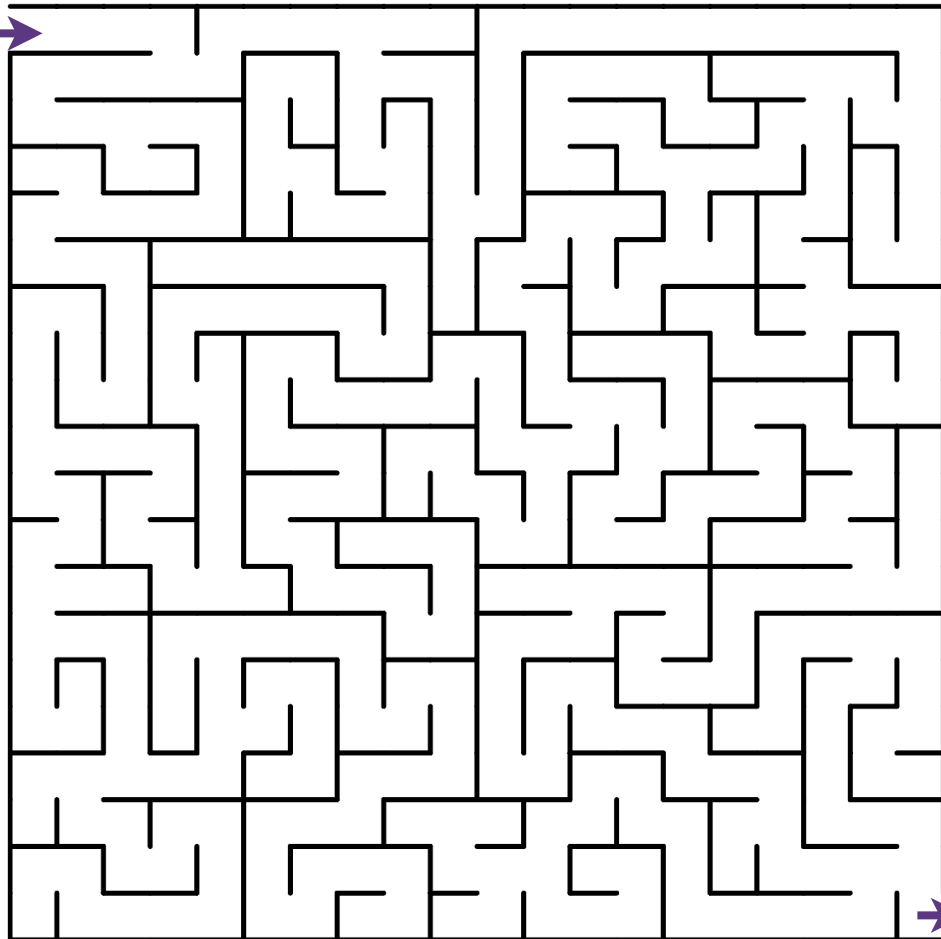
REMEMBER THIS
