**Pat Hix** - Is not doing too well. Afternoon visits are ok, but please call first.

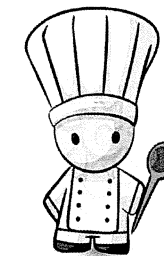
**Pam Kirkwood** - Will have a CT scan on May 8th.
