Dear Praying Friends,

Thank you for praying for the different avenues of outreach here in Nagykanizsa. We were excited last Wednesday to have our first family join us for our special olympics group at Andrew's elementary school. Their son really enjoyed the program, and his parents were glad that they found a therapy/development opportunity that he was willing to engage in. We gave them a little of our testimonies/what we do here as well. They would like to invite their acquaintances as well. Pray that God would allow us to be a blessing to this community in this way, and that we would have gospel opportunities with these families.

We started our English club at the school last Tuesday. We didn't have a lot of time before that to promote it, so no one came. We did pass out chocolate chip cookies to many of the students, though. We'll see tomorrow how it goes this week.

Sarah will be meeting with several ladies in the next weeks. Rami is the mother of one of Katie's classmates at kindergarten. She comes over once in a while to talk about life. Kata is one of the teachers at the school where we help with English. She has a lot of spiritual questions. Krisztina is one of our neighbors who works as a beautician in town here. Her mother recently passed away, and Sarah has already shared the gospel with her on a number of occasions.

We still haven't received official approval from the government for our Bible club at the children's home. I am not sure how aggressively to pursue this. We just need wisdom with that. Please do still pray for our home in Nyíregyháza to sell. I am not sure why God has had it take this long, but we need wisdom to understand his plan for this.

We will be talking with an immigration lawyer in the next weeks to try and determine the best path for our residency status going forward. The immigration laws were modified in 2024, and they eliminated the visa category we are currently using.

Our daughter, Katie (6), has been thinking a lot about spiritual things recently. Before, she usually tried to change the subject when family devotions became personal for her. Lately, she has been under conviction about being prepared for eternity. Last Monday as Sarah was saying good night to her, she whispered, "I want to get saved." I came over to her, and she told me the same

thing. She had never asked this before, so I took it seriously and went through the gospel again with her. I believe she understood that she deserved to go to Hell, and that Jesus was the only way to be saved from that. I helped her pray about it to God. It seems she has genuine peace about eternity now.

Andrew (8) was also touched by what was happening, and he wanted to be with us when Katie prayed. I told him that if he ever wanted to talk about salvation, he could tell me. I think he wanted to be a part of what Katie was doing, but he didn't seem to have the conviction she did. Please pray for his salvation. I think the gospel is becoming clearer to him.

Our family had the opportunity to minister at Lifewater Baptist Church in Budapest yesterday. It is always a blessing to be with that congregation as we have the chance.
